### **NOTICE OF PUBLIC REVIEW AND INTENT TO ADOPT A MITIGATED NEGATIVE DECLARATION**

A Mitigated Negative Declaration (MND) has been prepared by the California State Lands Commission (CSLC), as lead agency under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) (Pub. Resources Code, § 21000 et seq.), in response to an application submitted by Dynegy Morro Bay, LLC, for the Morro Bay Power Plant Marine Terminal Decommissioning Project (Project). The MND is in compliance with the requirements of CEQA, the State CEQA Guidelines (Cal. Code Regs., tit. 14, § 15000 et seq.), and CSLC Regulations (Cal. Code Regs., tit. 2, § 2901 et seq.). This Notice fulfills a State regulatory process noticing and review requirement for the CSLC.

**Project Title:** Morro Bay Power Plant Marine Terminal Decommissioning Project

**Project Location:** City of Morro Bay (Morro Bay Power Plant, Morro Rock Beach)

**Project Description:** Decommissioning of marine terminal facilities for Morro Bay Power Plant, which includes an existing underground 16-inch pipeline and 24-inch pipeline and associated support structures. Both pipelines and support structures will be removed within the power plant segment, the pipelines will be filled with cement and abandoned in place within the sand dune segment, and the pipelines will be removed within the beach, surf zone, and offshore segments. Decommissioning activities are anticipated for the summer of 2018.
