

24. The Executive Officer was instructed to make a report to the Commission with reference to personnel and re-arrangement of the organization of the staff of the Commission necessitated by the departure of two of the technical experts into the armed services. (Correspondence file)

25. Upon motion duly made and carried, a resolution was adopted whereby the State Lands Commission approved the extension to August 1, 1943, of the time within which the Commission may make formal objections to the 11th and 12th revisions of the participating acreage by the State in Rio Vista Gas Field, as provided for in Agreement for Easement No. 415 and that this extension will also apply to all revisions made subsequent to the 12th revision which have heretofore been accepted conditionally by the Commission, and that, further, the Commission should receive a waiver from the Standard Oil Company extending the fifteen day requirement in paragraph 4 of Exhibit "A" of the agreement, in which the State can make objection to the revisions, such waiver to allow the State sixty days within which to review, accept, or reject said revisions after submission of the basic aerial mosaic map. (Easement No. 415, Chapter 303-1921)

26. Upon motion duly made and carried, the State Lands Commission approved the development program as submitted by the Honolulu Oil Corporation in connection with State Oil and Gas Lease No. 56, and, further, that the State will require all lessees under oil and gas leases to conform to drilling requirements of the leases and the statutes under which the leases were granted. (Lease No. 56, Chap. 303-1921)

27. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Commission authorized the Executive Officer to expend an amount up to \$1,000.00 for a survey of unleased tide and submerged lands westerly of Lease No. 56 at Rincon Field in Ventura County, and to enter into a contract with the Division of Highways for this survey. (Lease No. 56, Chapter 303-1921)

28. The Commission discussed the application of the Union Oil Company to purchase or lease 8.31 acres of tideland adjacent to the Oleum Refinery on San Pablo Bay near Rodeo. After discussing the matter of value of this land, the Executive Officer was directed to obtain an appraisal of this land from competent firms. He was authorized to expend up to \$500.00 for this purpose. (No. 84, Public Resources Code)

29. A report was submitted and read to the Commission regarding State school lands embraced in outstanding contracts for which payment of balance of purchase price is demanded. Statements have been prepared for newspaper publication and for notice by registered mail to all parties in interest as required by the statutes, all of which will be transmitted not later than April 15, 1943. (Sacramento office)
