- 25. (Salary Increase Request Mr. A. P. Ireland Sacramento Office) Upon motion duly made and unanimously carried, a resolution was adopted authorizing the Executive Officer to request the Personnel Board to make a survey of Mr. Ireland's duties in the Division of State Lands in order to determine if his present salary is commensurate with the duties performed. The Executive Officer is to request the Personnel Board to expedite the survey and reclassification of this position.
- 26. (Salary Increase Request B. I. Cropsey) Upon motion duly made and unanimously carried, a resolution was adopted instructing the Executive Officer to request the Personnel Board to make a survey of the duties performed by B. I. Cropsey as Senior Account Clerk in view of the fact that the salary received by this employee under present classification is not commensurate with the duties performed or salaries paid for comparable duties by private industry.
- 27. (Petroleum Production Inspector Additional Position Huntington Beach) Upon motion duly made and unanimously carried, a resolution was adopted approving an additional position under this classification at Huntington Beach, and the appointment of William Cookerley to the position at a salary of \$220 plus \$25 effective April 7, 1944.
- 28. (Increase of Gaugers' Salaries to Maximum under Classification) Upon motion duly made and unanimously carried, approval was given for paying the maximum salary to Oil Gaugers; namely, \$190 plus \$25 with the understanding that said increase shall be effective on April 7 in the case of the following employees: Charles Struck, Robert Stricklin and Harry E. Williams, and for the unfilled gauger position at such time as it is filled.
- 29. (Offer of Braille Institute to Purchase Six Lots of Former University Land on Vermont) Upon motion duly made and unanimously carried, a resolution was adopted approving the offer of \$25,000.00 of the Braille Institute to purchase Lots 23, 24, 25, 26, 27 and 28, Tract 1206 on Vermont Avenue pursuant to Chapter 182, Statutes of 1943.

There being no further business to come before the Commission, the meeting was adjourned.
