Upon motion duly made and unanimously carried, a resolution was adopted authorizing deferment of action on the request to publish a notice of intention to receive bids for oil and gas development from the Alamitos Bay Park area pending receipt of the opinion from the Attorney General as to whether a filled-in island constitutes filled lands within the meaning of the Public Resources Code.

8. (Direct Sale of State's Royalty Share of Oil Produced under State Oil and Gas Leases) A report was presented to the Commission and discussed as to the factors involved in the determination of the relative advantages and disadvantages to accrue to the State under the proposal to sell the State's royalty share of oil produced under State oil and gas leases pursuant to public bid.

Upon motion duly made and unanimously carried, a resolution was adopted deferring final action for a period of sixty days upon the direct sale of the State's royalty share of oil produced under State oil and gas leases and requesting that any further data relative to the proposal be presented at the next meeting.

9. (Possible Oil Drainage, Tide and Submerged Lands at the Mouth of the Santa Clara River - Ventura County - 7.0. 131) Data relative to the production and location of a new Standard Oil Company well near the mouth of the Santa Clara River in Ventura County relative to the constitution of a threat of drainage from State land, were presented.

Upon notion duly made and unanimously carried, a resolution was adopted authorlains the icting Executive Officer to publish a notice of intention, pursuant to Section 1872 of the Public Resources Gode, to receive hids for an oil and gas lease on an area of State tide and submerged lands one mile in width, selected as to give maximum competition and extending northerly from the center of the mouth of the Santa Clara River, Ventura County, and three miles into the Pacific Ocean from the ordinary high water mark.

10. (Resurvey of Tideland Surveys Nos. 10 and 14, San Luis Obispo County - No. P.R.C. 233) The resurveys of Tideland Surveys Nos. 10 and 14, San Luis Obispo County, as made by Kenneth Beck, County Surveyor of San Luis Obispo County, pursuant to authorization by the Commission on June 21, 1946, were presented.

Upon motion duly made and unanimously carried, a resolution was adopted authorizing the Acting Executive Officer to approve the plats of the resurvey of Tideland Surveys Nos. 10 and 14, San Luis Chispo County, by Kenneth Beck, County Surveyor.

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
