17. (Shell Oil Company - Application for lease of tide and submerged lands, Los Angeles County - W.O. 587, P.R.C. 481) The Commission was informed that the Shell Oil Company has applied for a ten year lease of tide and submerged lands in Santa Monica Bay, Los Angeles County, approximately four miles up coast from the City of Santa Monica for the construction, maintenance and use or a service station. The lease of approximately 500 square feet of tide and submerged lands to be at an annual rental of \$50.00. The littoral land is leased by Shell Oil Company for a period of ten years with right of renewal for an additional five years.

Upon motion duly made and unanimously carried, a resolution was adopted authorising the Executive Officer to issue to Shell Oil Company a lease of tide and submerged lands in Santa Monica Bay totaling approximately 500 square feet in area for the construction, maintenance and use of a service station for a period of ten years subject to renewal for an additional five years, rental to be \$50,00 per year and adequate surety bond in the amount of \$1,000,00 to be furnished.

18. (Meredith Fish Company - Application for lease of tide and submerged lands, Solano County - W.O. 467, P.R.C. 482) The Commission was informed that the Meredith Fish Company of Sacramento has applied for a lease of approximately one acre of tide and submerged lands in Sacramento River at Rio Vista, Solano County, for the construction, maintenance and use of a wharf and dolphin, adjoining littoral land being leased from the City of Rio Vista. An office appraisal of land in the area indicates that the minimum rental should be \$50.00 per year. Exact location of the requested area is unknown pending determination of the boundary of State lands.

Upon motion duly made and unanimously carried, a resolution was adopted authorising the Executive Officer to issue to Meredith Fish Company of Sacramento, a lease covering not more than one acre of tide and submerged land in Sacramento River at Rio Vista, Solano County, for a period of fifteen years subject to renewal for an additional period of ten years, for the construction, maintenance and use of a wharf and dolphin at an annual rental of \$50.00 and upon the furnishing of adequate surety bond in the amount of \$1,000., description of the leased area to be furnished by the applicant lessee and attached to the lease as an amendment after determination of the boundary of State lands.

19. (Division of Highways - Right of way Permit - Three Wile Slough, Sacremento County - W.O. Lil, P.R.C. Lis) The Commission was informed that the Division of Highways has constructed a new bridge over Three Kile Slough in T. 3 N., R. 2 E., W.D.M., Sacramento County, and requests approval of a new right of way permit 200 feet in width across the slough and the relinquishment of the old right of way as approved by the Executive Officer November 23, 1940.

Upon motion duly made and unanimously carried, a resolution was adopted authorizing the Executive Officer to approve the application of the Division of Highways for a right of way across Three Hile Slough in T. 3 N., R. 2 E., M.D.M., Sacramento County, Highway District X, Route 11, Section 0, and the relinquishment of the old right of way approved by the Executive Officer November 23, 1940.

20. (Division of Highways - Right of way crossing Sacramento River at Rio Vista, Sacramento and Solano Counties - W.O. 171, P.R.C. high) The Commission was informed that the Division of Highways is rebuilding the bridge over Sacramento River at Rio Vista and has requested a 60 foot increase in width of the existing right of way (approved by the Executive Officer on November 23, 1940, and by the Commission September 15, 1949), to provide a right of way 260 feet in width between high water lines on opposite sides of the river.

Upon motion duly made and unanimously carried, a resolution was adopted authorizing the Executive Officer to approve the application of the Division of Highway: for the increased width to 260 feet of the right of way for the Sacramento River Bridge at Rio Vistor

21. (E. H. French - Application for lease of tide and submerged leady in Carquinez Strait, Centra Costa County, occupied by Granger's Warehouse - W.O. 462, P.R.C. 483) The Commission was informed that Mr. E. H. French who holds a bill of sale for the removal of Granger's Warehouse has applied for a lease of the tide and submerged lands in Carquinez Strait near Crockett occupied by that portion of the warehouse not removed. The land has been appraised at \$3,300.00 total for the 3.3 acres which under the 6% policy results in an annual rental of \$198.00.

Upon motion duly made and unanimously carried, a resolution was adopted authorizing the Executive Officer to issue to E. H. French a lease for 3.3 acres of tide and submerged lands in Carquines Strait, Contra Costa County, now occupied by that portion of Granger's Warehouse not removed, for a period of fifteen years at an annual rental of \$198.00 subject to renewal for an additional ten years at such rental as may be determined upon expiration of the original fifteen year period. The present contract and bill of sale in so far as requiring removal of the structure sold under date of November 23, 1949, is to be cancelled in favor of the new lease. Lesses to file bond in the amount of \$10,000.00 to guarantee lease performance, amount of bond to be subject to adjustment by the State two years after effective date of the lease upon removal of portions of the remaining structure.

22. (Holly Sugar Corporation - Application for lease of various areas for beet loading stations in Solano, Sacramento, San Josquin and Contra Costa Counties - W.O. 511, P.R.C. [18].) The Commission was informed that on July 29, 1949, it authorized the Executive Officer to review the entire matter of occupation of State lands by the Holly Sugar Corporation, and make appropriate recommendations to the Commission for final action. The Executive Officer has now completed the review and negotiations and has determined that thirteen beet loading stations are partially occupying State lands in Solano, Sacramento, San Joaquin and Contra Costa counties; that these stations are used from thirty to ninety days each per year; that the area of State land occupied by each is no more than a few hundred square feet; and that the number of stations required by the company for efficient handling of sugar beets may be increased or decreased as conditions change. Because of such possible increase or decrease in number of stations a fluctuating rental was deemed advisable, additions to or elimination of locations to be covered by amendments to the lease as required.

Upon motion duly made and unanimously carried, a resolution was adopted authorizing the Executive Officer to issue to the Holly Sugar Corporation a blanket lease covering all beet loading stations that company may have on State lands, each location to be a separate parcel and the number and description of parcels added to or removed from the original list to be covered by lease amendments, lessee to file a surety bond in the amount of \$5,000, period of the lease to be fifteen years subject to renewal for an additional ten years, rental to be as follows:

On execution of the agreement \$230.00; at the beginning of each successive rental year except the fifteenth year \$100.00 plus \$10.00 for each parcel in excess of ten being occupied by the Holly Sugar Corporation at the beginning of the rent year. At the beginning of the fifteenth rental year \$10.00 for each parcel in excess of ten.
