San Clemente Fishing Boats, Inc. has applied for three minor structure permits, each for four mooring buoy locations in the Pacific Ocean seaward of the San Clemente Municipal Pier. Mooring buoys will cost between \$100 and \$125 each and will be in place during the fishing season only. Permit fees and filing fees have been paid.

UPON MOTION DULY MADE AND UNANIMOUSLY CARRIED, A RESOLUTION WAS ADOPTED AUTHOR-IZING THE EXECUTIVE OFFICER TO ISSUE TO SAN CLEMENTE FISHING BOATS, INC. THREE MINOR STRUCTURE PERMITS, EACH FOR FOUR MOORING BUOY LOCATIONS IN THE EACIFIC OCEAN SEAWARD OF THE SAN CLEMENTE MUNICIPAL PIER, OR ANGE COUNTY, AT THE ES-TABLISHED PERMIT FEE OF \$15. FOR EACH PERMIT OR \$45.00 TOTAL FOR A PERIOD OF FIVE YEARS, NO BOND BEING REQUIRED.

10. (CITY OF LOS ANGELES, APPLICATION FOR HERMIT TO CONSTRUCT GROIN - SANTA MONICA BAY - W.O. 1017, P.R.C. 607) The City of los Angeles has applied for a permit to construct a groin in Santa Monica Bay adjacent to the State beach under the jurisdiction of the Division of Beaches and Parks and leased to the City of Los Angeles. Erosion at that point is endangering the State Highway. The Division of Beaches and Parks has approved the groin construction as far as the State Lands Commission is involved and is recommending to the State Park Commission, the upland owner, that approval be given by that body.

UPON MOTION DULY MADE AND UNANIMOUSLY CARRIED, A RESOLUTION WAS ADOPTED AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTIVE OFFICER TO ISSUE TO THE CITY OF LOS ANGELES A PERMIT TO CONSTRUCT A GROIN IN SANTA MONICA BAY ALTROXIMATELY 1500 FEET WEST OF SANTA MONICA CANYON UPON APPROVAL BY THE STATE PARK COMMISSION, THE LITTORAL OWNER, NO FEES NOR RENTALS ARE REQUIRED, THE CONSIDERATION BEING THE PROTECTION OF THE STATE PROPERTY UNDER THE JURISDICTION OF OTHER STATE AGENCIES.

11. (EXTENSION OF OIL AND GAS LEASE 56 (303-1921) HONOLULU OIL CORPORATION, RINCON OIL FIELD, VENTURA COUNTY - W.O. 743, P.R.C. 429) An application has been received from the Honolulu Oil Corporation for renewal and extension of Oil and Gas Lease No. 56 (303-1921), Rincon Oil Field. State Oil and Gas Lease No. 56 (303-1921) was issued April 21, 1931, for an initial period of 20 years and provides for additional extension periods of 10 years each under such reasonable terms and conditions as the State may determine at time of renewal. It is proposed that the extension of Lease 56 be issued in the same form approved by the Commission heretofore for all renewals and extensions of Chapter Fig. 1921 leases in the Rincon and Elased Oil fields, and specifically in the form authorized for the renewal and extension of Lease 90 (303-1921), Elacod Field, to the Honolulu Oil Corporation on November 21, 1949 (Minute Page 1016-1017, Item 7).

The original terms of lease 56 (303-1921), required the drilling of one well for each 10 acres of the total area of 121.26 acres leased. 8 wells were actually drilled in compliance with this requirement and it is proposed in connection with the renewal and extension that 41.86 acres of the original lease area will be expendened by the leases and 80 acres retained on the basis of 10 ways for each well explanate.

UPON MOTION DULY MADE AND UNANIMOUSLY CARRIED, A RESOLUTION WAS ADOPTED AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTIVE OFFICER TO ISSUE TO THE HONOLULU OIL CORPORATION, A 10 YEAR EXTENSION EFFECTIVE APRIL 21, 1951 OF STATE OIL AND GAS LEASE NO. 56 (303-1921), RINCON OIL FIELD, VENTURA COUNTY, SUBJECT TO THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS:

- 1. LEASE PERFORMANCE BOND IN THE AMOUNT OF \$20,000 TO BE FILED BY THE LESSEE
- 2. ADVANCE ANNUAL LEASE RENTAL TO BE \$400.00.

THE ISSUANCE OF THE RENEWAL AND EXTENSION OF OIL AND GAS LEASE 56 (303-1921) IS TO BE SUBJECT TO APPROVAL BY THE DEPARTMENT OF INTERIOR PURSUANT TO THE TERMS OF THE STIPULATION ENTERED INTO BETWLEN THE ATTORNEY GENERAL OF THE UNITED STATES AND THE ATTORNEY GENERAL OF CALIFORNIA, DATED JULY 26, 1947, AS EXTENDED IN 1950.

12. (EXTENSION OF OIL AND GAS LEASE 55 (303-1921), NEIL C. NEEDHAM, RINCON OIL FIELD, VENTURA COUNTY - W.O. 1041, P.R.C. 430) An application has been received from Neil C. Needham, Lessee under State Oil and Gas Lease No. 55 (303-1921); Rincon Oil Field, for renewal of the subject lease.

State Oil and Gas Lease No. 55 (303-1921) was issued May 15, 1931, for an initial period of twenty years and provides for extension for additional periods of ten years each under such reasonable terms and conditions as the State may determine at the time of renewal. The original terms of Lease 55 (303-1921) required the drilling of one well for each ten acres of the total lease area of 64.15 acres. Two wells were drilled in compliance with the lease requirements and one has been continued on production. 54.15 acres of the lease area were quitclaimed April 13, 1942 leaving an effective lease area of ten acres.

It is proposed that the extension of Lease 55 (303-1921) be issued in the same form approved by the Commission heretofore for all remains and extensions of Chapter 303-1921 leases in the Rincon and Elwood fields.

UPON MOTION DULY MADE AND UNANIHOUSIX CARRIED, A RESOLUTION WAS ADOPTED AUTHOR-IZING THE EXECUTIVE OFFICER TO ISSUE TO WEIL C. NEEDHAM A TEN YEAR EXTENSION OF STATE OIL AND GAS LEASE NO. 55 (303-1921), RINGON OIL FIELD, VENTURA COUNTY, EFFECTIVE MAY 15, 1951, SUBJECT TO THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS:

- 1. IEASE PERFORMANCE BOND IN THE AMOUNT OF \$30,000. TO BE FILED BY THE LESSEE.
- 2. ADVANCE ANNUAL LEASE RENTAL TO BE \$50.00.

THE ISSUANCE OF THE RENEWAL AND EXTINSION OF OIL AND GAS LEASE 35 (303-1921) IS TO BE SUBJECT TO APPROVAL BY THE DEPARTMENT OF INTERIOR PURSUANT TO THE TERMS OF THE STIPULATION ENTERED INTO BETWEEN THE ATTORNEY GENERAL OF THE UNITED STATES AND THE ATTORNEY GENERAL OF CALLFORNIA, DATED JULY 26, 1947, AS EXTENDED IN 1950.
