The Commission has received a communication from Semator Charles Brown, and another from the laye County Assessor, Stewart B. Cor, advising that the City of Los Angeles' proposed exchange includes certain land adjacent to the meander line of Owens Lake and others in the visinity of Emimee Reservoir. When this matter was heard before the laye County officials on July 20, 1951, Semator Brown informed the Dureau of Land Management and the City of Los Angeles that Two County and the State were opposed to the proposed exchange, and further that the matter would be brought to the attention of the State Lands Comsission.

Senate at one time passed a resolution against the land moquisition by Los Angeles, and later agreed to a modified bill which did not affect the rights of the State, mining interests, and grazing rights. This bill did not get a considerable area of Federal lands in Inyo and Mono Countles, but so far Federal legislation to permit this acquisition has been blooked. Also, a great deal of the public domain in Inyo and Mono Countles has been withdrawn from public entry by the Bureau of Land Management for the benefit of the C117 through Congress.
