

20. (AUTHORITY OF EXECUTIVE OFFICER TO ISSUE SUBPOENAS AND ADMINISTER OATHS TO WITNESSES AT ALPINE-TUOLUMNE COUNTY HEARING - W.O. 710.) At its meeting on June 30, 1952 (Minute Page 1529, Item 29), the State Lands Commission authorized the Executive Officer to conduct a Public Hearing on the matter of the location of the common boundary line of Alpine and Tuolumne Counties. This hearing has been scheduled for the latter part of October, 1952. It may be necessary that subpoenas be issued for the attendance of witnesses, and it will be desirable that the witnesses give testimony under oath. Under the provisions of Section 6103 of the Public Resources Code and of Sections 11180 to 11184 inclusive of the Government Code, the Commission is empowered to discharge these functions and to delegate any or all of them.

UPON MOTION DULY MADE AND UNANIMOUSLY CARRIED, A RESOLUTION WAS ADOPTED DELEGATING TO THE EXECUTIVE OFFICER ALL OF THE POWERS CONFERRED UPON THE STATE LANDS COMMISSION BY SECTIONS 11180 TO 11184 INCLUSIVE OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE, FOR THE PURPOSE OF CONDUCTING THE HEARING AUTHORIZED BY THE COMMISSION ON THE MATTER OF THE LOCATION OF THE COMMON BOUNDARY LINE OF ALPINE AND TUOLUMNE COUNTIES.

21. (APPLICATION FOR PERMIT FOR STORM DRAINAGE CONSTRUCTION, SEAL SLOUGH, SAN MATEO COUNTY, CITY OF SAN MATEO - W.O. 1277, P.R.C. 768.1.) Seal Slough, also known as San Mateo Slough, lies within swamp and overflowed lands sold by the State. To avoid possible objection by the State after construction of flood-control structures, the City of San Mateo has applied for a permit to do the necessary work prior to start of construction.

UPON MOTION DULY MADE AND UNANIMOUSLY CARRIED, A RESOLUTION WAS ADOPTED AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTIVE OFFICER TO ISSUE TO THE CITY OF SAN MATEO A PERMIT FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF FLOOD-CONTROL DAMS, LEVEES, AND CHANNEL IMPROVEMENT IN AND ADJACENT TO SEAL SLOUGH, SAN MATEO COUNTY, THE CONSIDERATION BEING THE PROTECTION OF ADJOINING PROPERTY FROM FLOOD DAMAGE AND THE PROTECTION OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH.

22. (APPLICATION TO DREDGE, NAPA RIVER, NAPA COUNTY, OLYMPIAN DREDGING COMPANY - W.O. 1315, P.R.C. 769.1.) The Olympian Dredging Company has a contract with Pacific Gas and Electric Company to dredge an area in Napa River for the installation of pipe lines transporting gas. Pacific Gas and Electric Company was granted a right-of-way easement on August 29, 1951, for the pipe lines. Dredged material, amounting to an estimated 10,000 cubic yards, can be deposited only in Horseshoe Bend (an abandoned section of Napa River) or on privately owned land; otherwise it must be hauled 30 miles to San Pablo Bay. Mr. Earl Stewart, owner of land adjacent to the proposed pipe line crossing, has given permission for the deposit of the dredged material on his land which is used for the growing of hay. Permit is requested for the temporary deposit of spoils in Horseshoe Bend, to be removed later and placed on land owned by Mr. Stewart.

UPON MOTION DULY MADE AND UNANIMOUSLY CARRIED, A RESOLUTION WAS ADOPTED AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTIVE OFFICER TO ISSUE TO OLYMPIAN DREDGING COMPANY A ONE-YEAR LEASE OF A PORTION OF NAPA RIVER, KNOWN AS HORSESHOE BEND, FOR THE TEMPORARY DEPOSIT OF APPROXIMATELY 10,000 CUBIC YARDS OF DREDGED MATERIAL TO BE REMOVED FROM THE RIGHT OF WAY ACROSS NAPA RIVER GRANTED ON AUGUST 29, 1951, TO PACIFIC GAS AND ELECTRIC COMPANY UNDER EASEMENT P.R.C. 643, MATERIAL SO DEPOSITED TO BE REMOVED WITHIN THE ONE-YEAR LEASE PERIOD, LEASE TO ISSUE UPON PAYMENT OF A \$100 RENTAL AND THE STATUTORY FILING FEE, AND UPON ISSUANCE OF AN ARMY PERMIT BY THE U. S. CORPS OF ENGINEERS, PERFORMANCE BOND IN THE AMOUNT OF \$1000 TO BE FURNISHED.
