

20. (GEOLOGICAL SURVEY PERMIT, LOS ANGELES, VENTURA AND SANTA BARBARA COUNTIES, RICHFIELD OIL CORPORATION - W. O. 2252, P.R.C. 1714.1.) The following report was presented to the Commission:

"An application has been received from Richfield Oil Corporation for permission to conduct geological exploration from mobile marine equipment during the period May 1, 1956 through October 31, 1956. Permission has been requested to conduct core drilling operations below a depth of 500 feet beneath the ocean floor in those tide and submerged lands under the jurisdiction of the Commission in the area between the Los Angeles and Orange County line and a line drawn due West from Point Arguello, Santa Barbara County. The statutory application filing fee has been paid by the applicant."

UPON MOTION DULY MADE AND UNANIMOUSLY CARRIED, IT WAS RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS:

THE EXECUTIVE OFFICER IS AUTHORIZED TO ISSUE TO RICHFIELD OIL CORPORATION A GEOLOGICAL SURVEY PERMIT CONFORMING TO THE OPERATING CONDITIONS DETERMINED BY THE COMMISSION MAY 18, 1956, FOR THE PERIOD JUNE 1, 1956 THROUGH OCTOBER 31, 1956, IN ORDER TO OBTAIN GEOLOGICAL INFORMATION INVOLVING DEPTHS IN EXCESS OF 500 FEET BELOW THE SURFACE OF THE OCEAN FLOOR IN TIDE AND SUBMERGED LANDS LYING OFFSHORE IN THE COUNTIES OF LOS ANGELES AND VENTURA AND SOUTHERLY OF A LINE DRAWN DUE WEST FROM POINT ARGUELLO, SANTA BARBARA COUNTY. THE PERMITTEE IS TO REIMBURSE THE STATE LANDS COMMISSION FOR ALL OF ITS INSPECTION COSTS.

21. (GEOLOGICAL SURVEY PERMIT, ORANGE, LOS ANGELES, VENTURA AND SANTA BARBARA COUNTIES, UNION OIL COMPANY OF CALIFORNIA - W. O. 2272, P.R.C. 1715.1.) The following report was presented to the Commission:

"An application has been received from Union Oil Company of California for permission to conduct geological exploration from mobile marine equipment during the period May 1, 1956 through October 31, 1956. Permission has been requested to conduct core drilling operations below a depth of 500 feet beneath the ocean floor in those tide and submerged lands under the jurisdiction of the Commission in the offshore area between Pt. Arguello, Santa Barbara County, and northerly of the city limits of the City of Newport Beach. The statutory application filing fee has been paid by the applicant."

THE EXECUTIVE OFFICER IS AUTHORIZED TO ISSUE TO UNION OIL COMPANY OF CALIFORNIA A GEOLOGICAL SURVEY PERMIT CONFORMING TO THE OPERATING CONDITIONS DETERMINED BY THE COMMISSION MAY 18, 1956, FOR THE PERIOD JUNE 1, 1956 THROUGH OCTOBER 31, 1956, IN ORDER TO OBTAIN GEOLOGICAL INFORMATION INVOLVING DEPTHS IN EXCESS OF 500 FEET BELOW THE SURFACE OF THE OCEAN FLOOR IN TIDE AND SUBMERGED LANDS LYING SOUTHERLY OF A LINE DRAWN DUE WEST FROM PT. ARGUELLO, SANTA BARBARA COUNTY, AND LYING NORTHERLY AND WESTERLY OF THE EXTENSION SEAWARD OF THE NORTHERLY LIMITS OF THE CITY OF NEWPORT BEACH, ORANGE COUNTY. THE PERMITTEE IS TO REIMBURSE THE STATE LANDS COMMISSION FOR ALL OF ITS INSPECTION COSTS.
