(REVISION OF MINUIE ITEM 17, PAGE 2950, DECEMBER 5, 1956 - W. 0. 124.)
Applications for purchase of tide and submergea lands in Petaluma Creek, Marin County, under W. O. 124 included thirteen parcels pursuant to Chapter 1834, Statutes of 1953, and to Sections 7729 and 7730 of the Public Resources Code. The Resolution approved by the Commission contains, in the minutes, a typographical error specifying the Statutes of 1935 instead of 1953. A proviso in the calendar item and minute item requires that the applicants apply for sad obtein State Lands Commission leases or permits for any existing structure or structures extending beyond the watervard line of the areas authorized to be sold. Following discussion with the California Pacific Title Insuxance Company and the San Rafael Land Title Company, it has been determined that a commitrant had been made by the Assistant Executive Officer conceming authorized sale of the land. Requirement that application lease or permit for the existing structures beyond the waterward line of the area authorized to be sold is not in accordance with said agreement. Action in this respect. can be undertaken after land title matters are disposed of.

IT IS THEREFORE RECOMMENDED THAT THE DATE " 1935 " IN THE RESOLUTION APPROVED BY THE COMMISSION ON DECEMBER 5, 1956 (MINUTE ITEM 17, PAGE 2950) BE CORRECTIED SO THAT "1935" BE CHANGED TO " 1953 "; AND THAT THE PROVISION FOR THE APFLICATION FOR AND OETAINING OF A IEASE OR PERMIT BE STRICKEN FROM THE MINUTESS.
