After presentation of Calendar Item 6 attached, and upon motion duly made and unanimously carried, the following resolution was adopted:

THE EXECUTIVE OFFICER IS AUTHORIZED TO ISSUE TO THE STANISLAUS COUNTY ROAD COMMISSIONER A PERMIT FOR THE PERIOD AUGUST 14, 1958 TO JANUARY 31, 1959, INCLUSIVE, TO EXCAVATE FROM THE CHANNEL OF THE SAN JOAQUIN RIVER, STANISLAUS COUNTY, MATERIAL TO BE USED FOR BRIDGE APPROACHES AND ROADS. THE PERMIT SHALL LIMIT THE EXCAVATED MATERIAL TO A MAXIMUM OF 40,000 CUBIC YARDS. THE CONSIDERATION FOR THIS PERMIT IS THAT THE EXTRACTION WILL BE BENEFICIAL AS A CHANNEL CLEARANCE PROJECT.

## MINERAL LEASE

6.

(APPLICATION TO USE EXCAVATED MATERIAL, STANISLAUS COUNTY ROAD COMMISSIONER, SAN JOAQUIN RIVER, STANISLAUS COUNTY - W. O. 2999.)

An application has been received from the Stanislaus County Road Commissioner for a permit to use material excavated from the channel of the San Joaquin River on bridge approaches and for roads. A right-of-way easement, P.R.C. 2202.9, for the bridge site has been issued by this Division for the construction of the new Las Palmas Bridge on the F.A.S.D.S. 916 (3) Route. The Corps of Engineers, the Department of Water Resources and The Reclamation Board have concurred in a channel clearance project in connection with the construction of the new bridge. Section 6303, Public Resources Code, provides in part: "When a contractor or permittee has a contract with or a permit from the Federal Government or any authorized public agency to dredge navigable streams for the improvement of navigation, the commission may, when in the best interests of the State, allow such contractor or permittee to have sand, gravel, or other spoils dredged from the sovereign lands of the State located within the areas specified in such contract or permit without paying a royalty therefor. The amounts of sand, gravel or other spoils so removed from sovereign lands shall not exceed those specified in the contract or permit."

The applicant has estimated that approximately 40,000 cubic yards of material will be required and that the project will be completed by February 1, 1959.

IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT THE EXECUTIVE OFFICER ISSUE TO THE STANISLAUS COUNTY ROAD COMMISSIONER A PERMIT FOR THE PERIOD AUGUST 14, 1958 TO JANUARY 31, 1959, INCLUSIVE, TO EXCAVATE FROM THE CHANNEL OF THE SAN JOAQUIN RIVER, STANISLAUS COUNTY, MATERIAL TO BE USED FOR BRIDGE APPROACHES AND ROADS.
