CALENDAR ITEM

4.

SELECTION OF VACANT FEDERAL LAND, LIEU LAND APPLICATION NO. 5058, SACRAMENTO LAND DISTRICT, MENDOCINO COUNTY, H. L. MACTAGGART - S.W.O. 5858.

An offer has been received from H. L. MacTaggart of La Mirada, California, to purchase the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 33, T. 23 N., R. 14 W., M.D.M., containing 40 acres in Mendocino County. This land may be obtained by the State under the indemnity selection procedure. The applicant made an offer of \$200, or \$5 per acre.

A staff appraisal shows that the land is not suitable for cultivation without artificial irrigation and establishes its value at an average of \$109 per acre, including timber, or a total value of \$4,360. By letter dated August 17, 1959, the applicant requested cancellation of the application because he did not wish to meet the appraised value.

The selection of the subject land is considered to be to the advantage of the State in that it will assist the State in satisfying the loss to the School Land Grant and in addition, after sale, will place the land on the tax rolls of the county in which it is situated.

The State's application to select the land has been accepted by the Bureau of Land Management, and the land was listed (conveyed) to the State on March 19, 1958.

1. DETERMINE THAT IT IS TO THE ADVANTAGE OF THE STATE TO SELECT THE SW $\frac{1}{4}$ OF SW $\frac{1}{4}$ OF SECTION 33, T. 23 N., R. 14 W., M.D.M., CONTAINING 40 ACRES IN MENDOCINO COUNTY;
2. APPROVE THE SELECTION OF SAID LAND; AND
3. AUTHORIZE THE SALE THEREOF PURSUANT TO THE RULES AND REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE SALE OF VACANT STATE SCHOOL LAND.

SELECTION OF VACANT FEDERAL LAND, LIEU LAND APPLICATION NO. 10773-H, LOS ANGELES LAND DISTRICT, SAN BERNARDINO COUNTY, GEORGE MCCARTHY - S.W.O. 5804.

An offer has been received from George McCarthy of Apple Valley, California, to purchase Section 29, T. 4 N., R. 3 E., S.B.M., containing 640 acres in San Bernardino County. This land may be obtained by the State from the Federal Government under the indemnity selection procedure. The applicant made an offer of \$3,200, or \$5 per acre.

The applicant did not desire to proceed with acquisition of the land and his application was canceled at his request.

The selection of the subject land is considered to be to the advantage of the State in that it will assist the State in satisfying the loss to the School Land Grant and in addition will, after sale, place the land on the tax rolls of the county in which it is situated.

This land may be obtained by the State from the Federal Government under the indemnity selection procedure. The applicant made an offer of \$800, or \$5 per acre.

The applicant did not desire to proceed with acquisition of the land and his application was canceled at his request.

The selection of the subject land is considered to be to the advantage of the State in that it will assist the State in satisfying the loss to the School Land Grant and in addition will, after sale, place the land on the tax rolls of the county in which it is situated.

An offer has been received from M. Penn Phillips of Azusa, California, to purchase the $SE\frac{1}{4}$ of $SW\frac{1}{4}$, $SE\frac{1}{4}$, $S\frac{1}{2}$ of $NE\frac{1}{4}$, $NE\frac{1}{4}$ of $NE\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 30, and $N\frac{1}{2}$ of $NE\frac{1}{4}$ and $NE\frac{1}{4}$ of $NW\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 31, T. 10 N., R. 1 E., S.B.M., containing a total of 440 acres in San Bernardino County. This land may be obtained by the State from the Federal Government under the indemnity selection procedure. The applicant made an offer of \$2,200, or \$5 per acre.

The applicant did not desire to proceed with acquisition of the land and his application was canceled at his request.
