

MINUTE ITEM

3. LONG BEACH BOUNDARY DETERMINATION, CHAPTER 2000/57 - W.O. 2716.

Mr. H. E. Ridings, Jr., President of the Board of Harbor Commissioners, appeared on behalf of the City of Long Beach and requested another continuance of the matter. He reported that progress was being made rapidly toward completion of unitization of Fault Block IV, and that to bring the boundary matter to a head at this time could cause serious problems hindering the unitization in Fault Blocks IV and V, which unitization is necessary to complete the subsidence control program.

Deputy Attorney General Jay L. Shavelson, on behalf of the office of the Attorney General, informed the Commission that there had been no change in the status of negotiations subsequent to the last meeting.

UPON MOTION MADE BY COMMISSIONER CARR, SECONDED BY COMMISSIONER CRANSTON, AND UNANIMOUSLY CARRIED, ACTION ON THE LONG BEACH BOUNDARY DETERMINATION, PURSUANT TO CHAPTER 2000 OF THE STATUTES OF 1957, WAS CONTINUED UNTIL THE NEXT REGULAR MEETING OF THE STATE LANDS COMMISSION.
