FINAL STATUS OF LEGISLATION - 1964 FIRST EXTRAORDINARY SESSION - W.O. 4800.

The following report on bills introduced which could affect the administrative cognizance or operations of the Commission shows the final status as of June 12, 1964:

A.B. 4	Dymally and Garrigus	Amends Sec. 6816 of the Public Resources Code. Transfers specified sum from tidelands oil revenues to the State School Fund rather than General Fund.	Died in Committee.
A.B. 16	Porter	Amends Sec. 6816 of the Public Resources Code. Revises formula for deposit of revenues in General Fund after certain specified amounts paid into California Water Fund.	Died in Committee.
A.B. 17	Porter, et al.	Amends Sec. 6816 of the Public Resources Code, re disposition of revenues received by the State, except those rents, royalties, etc., accruing from the use of State school lands. Also amends Sec. 12938 of the Water Code to delete certain legislative authority.	From Senate without further action.
A.B. 19	Petris, et al.	Adds Chapter 4 to Division 1 of the Harbors and Navigation Code, re San Francisco Bay. Creates San Francisco Bay Advisory Commission which would make an overall study of filling in San Francisco Bay.	Died in Committee.
A.B. 29	Z'berg and Petris	Adds Sec. 6310 to the Public Resources Code. Prohibits the development of undeveloped tide and submerged lands bordering on San Francisco Bay which have been granted to municipalities by the State unless grantee obtains the permission of the State Lands Commission.	From Senate without further action.

A.B. 30	Petris and Z'berg	Adds Chapter 4 to Division 1 of the Harbors and Navigation Code. Prohibits any filling in San Francisco Bay, except for U. S. projects, for three years.	Died in Committee.
A.B. 36	Z'berg and Petris	New act re San Francisco Bay. Provides that S.L.C. discount next 3 years in determining the 10-year period in which grantees of tide and submerged lands bordering San Francisco Bay are required to improve such lands.	From Senate without further action.
A.B. 57	Bagley	Frees certain tide and submerged lands previously granted in trust to County of Marin from trust for navigation, commerce, and fisheries, and authorizes the exchange of said lands for other lands of comparable value.	Approved by Governor on April 20. Chapter 49.
A.B. 86	Thomas	Amends Sec. 5 of, and repeals Sec. 7 of, Ch. 29, Stats. 1956, 1st E.S., and adds Part 8 to Division 8 of Harbors and Navigation Code. Deletes authority of Long Beach to spend tidelands oil revenues for navigation, commerce, fisheries, and other uses, etc., imposed by Ch. 676, Stats. of 1911, and Ch. 102, Stats. 1925 (as amended by Ch. 158, Stats. 1935). Increases the State's share of Long Beach tideland oil revenue.	Died in Committee.
A.B. 90	Monagon	Adds Sec. 16654 to Government Code. Requires that State bonds authorized for issuance in 1964 be reduced by amount of additional revenue received from tidelands or tidelands development as a result of any legislation enacted in 1964.	Died in Committee.

A.B. 132	Unruh, et al.	New act re Long Beach tidelands. Determines that oil and gas revenues derived from granted Long Beach tidelands be divided in an equitable manner between the State and Long Beach. Orders Long Beach to prepare and enter into agreements with competent persons and defines uses and purposes for which Long Beach can spend its share of the revenue. Describes Long Beach tidelands area.	Died in Committee.
A.C.R. 23	Belotti	Requests the State Lands Commission to survey the low water mark of Clear Lake and to study and make a recommendation to the Legislature with respect to who should be responsible for debris removal and maintenance of the lake bottom.	Filed with Secretary of State on May 20. Res. Chapter 77.
A.J.R. 1	Petris	Memorializes Congress to provide necessary legislation and sufficient funds to continue operation of the San Francisco Bay model constructed by U. S. Army Engineers.	From Senate without further action.
H.R. 93	Ryan	Assigns to an appropriate Assembly interim committee the problem connected with filling of San Francisco Bay at International Airport. Committee to report at 1965 Regular Session.	From committee without further action.

S.B. 2	Farr, et al.	New act providing for the determination of the boundaries of the tide and submerged lands conveyed in trust to the City of Long Beach, and making an appropriation for that purpose.	Died in Committee.

S.B. 4	Farr, et al.	Revokes the right and title of the City of Long Beach to all deposits of minerals in tide and submerged lands previously granted in trust. Provides for substitution of State Lands Commission for City of Long Beach in existing oil and gas contracts. Provides for disposition of Long Beach oil and gas revenues.	Died in Committee.
S.B. 14	McAteer	Creates San Francisco Bay Conservation Study Commission prescribing membership and powers and duties thereof.	Approved by the Governor on May 19, 1964. Chapter 98
S.B. 24	Christensen, et al.	Add Sec. 5016.5 to Public Resources Code. Sets aside funds derived from revenues received by the State in connection with the production of oil and gas as provided by any statute enacted at the 1964 1st. E.S. Fund to be administered by Dept. of Parks & Recreation (by formula prescribed in the bill) to supplement tax base of those school districts in which State park lands are located.	Died in Committee.
S.B. 25	Christensen	Revokes title of City of Long Beach to minerals under the tide-lands granted to City. Provides for substitution of State for City of Long Beach in existing oil and gas contracts. Provides for disposition of Long Beach oil and gas revenues.	Died in Committee.
S.B. 28	Gibson	Grants in trust to City of Benicia certain salt marsh, tide and submerged lands for furtherance of navigation, commerce and fisheries and for establishment of a harbor and airport, etc.	Approved by Governor on April 16. Chapter 18.

Of revenues deposited in State Treasury in each fiscal year: \$11,000,000 to Water Fund; up to \$50,000,000 to Educational Facilities Construction Fund; balance to General Fund.	Died in Committee.
S.B. 45	Collier, et al.	Repeals authority of City of Long Beach to spend oil revenues for navigation, commerce, fisheries, and other uses, etc., imposed by Ch. 676, Stats. 1911, Ch. 102, Stats. 1925 (as amended by Ch. 158, Stats. 1935). Increases State's share of oil revenue to 100%.	Died in Committee
S.B. 60	Burns, et al.	New act re Long Beach tidelands. Determines that oil and gas revenues derived from granted Long Beach tidelands be divided in an equitable manner between the State and Long Beach. Orders the State Lands Commission and Long Beach to prepare and enter into agreements with competent persons and defines uses and purposes for which Long Beach can spend its share of the revenue. Establishes boundary of Long Beach tidelands area.	Approved by the Governor on June 4, 1964. Chapter 138.
S.B. 71	O'Sullivan	Amends Secs. 5 and 12, repeals Sec. 7, Ch. 29, Stats. 1956, 1st E.S., amends Sec. 12912 Water Code. Increases State's share of Long Beach tidelands revenue to be deposited in General Fund rather than California Water Fund.	Died in Committee.

S.B. 86	Farr, et al.	Amends, repeals and adds various secs. to Ch. 29, Stats. 1956, 1st E.S., and Water Code. Directs Long Beach to pay all oil and gas revenue to State except for annual appropriations not to exceed \$10 million; provided that total amount approp. does not exceed \$100 million or 5 percent of oil revenues received within the initial 20-year period. Specifies certain provisions to be incorporated into future agreements.	Died in Committee.
S.B. 106	Dolwig	Adds Sec. 5.5, Ch. 29, Stats. 1956, 1st E.S., and amends Sec. 12912, Water Code. Requires Long Beach to pay to State all tideland oil revenue. Requires City to submit annual budgets to S.L.C. for expenditures for harbor trust purposes.	Died in Committee.
S.B. 109	Farr	Provides that if no legislation is enacted at 1964 1st. E.S. revising the distribution of Long Beach tideland oil revenue between the State and Long Beach, the S.L.C. shall not approve any contract for development of oil and gas from the presently undeveloped Long Beach tidelands, and all revenue from Long Beach tidelands shall be impounded and may not be expended for any purpose.	Died in Committee.
S.C.R. 16	Petersen	Requests the State Lands Commission to survey the low water mark of Clear Lake and to study and make a recommendation to the Legislature with respect to who should be responsible for debris removal and maintenance of the lake bottom.	Filed with Secretary of State on May 13. Res. Chapter 58.
S.R. 123	Collier	Relative to a study of claims for compensation for participation in litigation involving the Long Beach tidelands.	Died in Committee.
