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AUTHORIZATION FOR SUIT FOR EJECTMENT

APPLICANT:

Robert Torrey, Bradford J. Jeffry, et al., dba Paradise Point Manina c/o Jeffry, Gibson and Barbour P. O. Box 1371 Stockton, Galifornia 95201

AREA, TYPE LAND AND LOCATION: A 1.13+ acre parcel of tide and submerged land in Disappointment Slough, San Joaquin County.

BACKGROUND:

The Division received Department of the Army, Corps of Engineer's, Public Notice No. 5191 dated March 7, 1974, regarding the approval of plans for an existing marina and authorization for additional construction in Disappointment Slough and Bishop Cut adjacent to Bishop Tract, San Joaquin County: Investigation by Division staff showed that a portion of the proposed project would occupy State tide and submerged land for which no permit or lease existed. Applicant was so notified by the Division's letter dated March 20, 1974, and applicant was requested to make application to the State Lands Commission for appropriate authority for the proposed project.

Application dated July 10, 1974, was received by the Division with a transmittal letter dated November 11, 1974, claiming exemption from CEQA as an existing facility. This application was denied and a request was made by the Division that application be made not by the upland owners but by the marine operator. An application from the marine operator was received on January 27, 1975. Applicant was requested to supply additional engineering data in March 1975.

CURRENT SITUATIONA

Upon completion of staff engineering and appraisel, proposed lease documents were submitted to applicant for review and execution on September 2, 1976. By letter dated October 6, 1976, applicant/attorney responded with a claim that the State had no ownership of the area occupied by marina facilities.

Division inswered that although portions of the marina occupied Bishop Cut, an artificial channel not claimed by the State, other portions occupied an area of Disappointment Slough, a natural tidal waterway, claimed as sovereign lands of the State, and that the proposed lease covered only those portions attorney was again asked to execute and return lease. Applicant/attorney then requested maps showing lease area and such were supplied by letter dated November 16, 1976.

Several follow-up attempts by telephone and written correspondence were made by Division attorney now states that the State has made no and that applicant will not concede anything attorney stands ready to accept service of operators.
