APPLICANT: Department of Fish and Game
1416 9th Street
Sacramento, California 95814

AREA, TYPE LAND AND LOCATION:
Selected submerged land areas in the
Sacramento-San Joaquin River System.

LAND USE: Salmon spawning habitat rehabilitation
projects.

TERMS OF PROPOSED PERMIT:
Initial period: 5 years from May 1, 1978,

CONSIDERATION: The public use and benefit.

PREREQUISITE TERMS, FEES AND EXPENSES:
Applicant is permittee of upland.

STATUTORY AND OTHER REFERENCES:
A. Public Resources Code: Div. 6, Parts 1 & 2.
B. Administrative Code: Title 2, Div. 3,
Arts. 1, 2, 10 & 11.

OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:
1. The Department of Fish and Game is
proposing to rehabilitate selected
salmon spawning areas, over the next
5 years, in the Sacramento-San Joaquin
River System that support anadromous
fishery.
2. The work would include loosening compacted
gravel, constructing low level berms
to retain spawning gravels, adding
gravel (mostly native) to spawning
site, and modification of side channels
that have historically maintained a
spawning population.
3. The work to be performed by Fish and
Game will be at each selected site,

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substantially similar in nature. The issuance of this permit would eliminate the processing of individual permits for each selected site.

4. The Department of Fish and Game will submit a complete description of each rehabilitation site to the Commission's staff at least 30 days prior to initiation of the work.
5. This project is exempt from CEQA because the project involves maintenance of streamflows and stream channels to protect fish and wildlife resources.

Authority: 14 Cal. Adm. Code 15101, Class 1 (i).

6. This project is situated on land identified as possessing environmental values in that the State Lands Commission stated all waterways under the Commission's jurisdiction have environmental significance. Staff finds this project to be acceptable in that it is designed to enhance the environmental values of the waterway.

State Reclamation Board, Regional Water Quality Control Board.

United States Army Corps of Engineers (pending).

IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT THE COMMISSION:

1. DETERMINE THAT AN EIR HAS NOT BEEN PREPARED FOR THIS ACTIVITY AS SUCH REPORT IS NOT REQUIRED UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF P.R.C. 21085, 14 CAL. ADM. CODE 15100 ET SEQ., AND 2 CAL. ADM. CODE 2907.
2. FIND THAT THIS PROJECT IS SITUATED ON LAND IDENTIFIED AS POSSESSING ENVIRONMENTAL VALUES IN THAT THE STATE LANDS COMMISSION STATED ALL WATERWAYS UNDER THE COMMISSION'S JURISDICTION HAVE ENVIRONMENTAL SIGNIFICANCE,

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BUT THAT THIS PROJECT IS COMPATIBLE WITH THAT STATEMENT AS IT APPLIES TO THE SUBJECT LANDS.

3. AUTHORIZE ISSUANCE TO DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME OF A 5-YEAR GENERAL PERMIT - PUBLIC AGENCY USE FROM MAY 1, 1978; IN CONSIDERATION OF THE PUBLIC USE AND BENEFIT; FOR SALMON SPAWNING HABITAT REHABILITATION PROJECTS ON THE LAND DESCRIBED ON EXHIBIT "A" ATTACHEL AND BY REFERENCE MADE A PART HEREOF.
