AREA, TYPE LAND AND LOCATION:

A 31.62 acre parcel of submerged land in a former channel of the Sac mento River (aka Collins Eddy), near Robbins, Sutter

and Yolo Counties.

LAND USE:

Incorporation of the State's interest in the former Sacramento River Channel into the Collins Eddy Wildlife Area for preservation of the natural habitat and to provide recrea-

tional uses.

TERMS OF PROPOSED PERMIT:

Initial period:

49 years from April 27,

1978.

CONSIDERATION:

The public use and benefit, with the State reserving the right at any time to set a monetary rental if the Commission finds such action to be in the State's best interest.

PREREQUISITE TERMS, FEES AND EXPENSES:

Applicant is owner of upland.

of Fish and Game, portions of the former Sacramento River Channel (Collins Eddy) were the site at an illegal trash dump.

- 3. Since the Department of Fish and Game agreed to undertake the responsibility of cleaning-up and abating the dump, the State Lands Commission, as part of the Executive Officer's Report, at its meeting of April 27, 1978 authorized the Department to erect a fence around the perimeter of the illegal dump site to eliminate vehicular access and additional dumping prior to the Department's cleaning-up the dump site.
- 4. The trash dump has now been eliminated and the Department of Fish and Game, in order to fulfill its management goals for the Collins Eddy Wildlife Area, wishes to incorporate the State's interest in the former Sacramento River Channel into the Collins Eddy Wildlife Area to protect and preserve the fish and wildlife resources within this area.
- 5. Because of the public benefit that will be derived by the issuance of this permit, staff recommends that the usual processing fee be waived.
- 6. This project is exempt from CEQA because it is an action by a regulatory agency for the protection of the environment.
