TEMPORARY USE PERMIT

BACKGROUND:

meeting.

At its February, 1978 meeting the Commission approved an emergency permit to the Department of Fish and Game for wildlife habitat protection work at Mono Lake. That work consisted of using explosives to remove a land bridge that had formed within the lake and was providing predator access to nesting California gulls. The land bridge was forming due to the receding water level of Mono Lake. The bridge removal work was completed during the spring months, prior to the arrival of the nesting gulls.

Since that time the water level of the lake has continued to recede, and land bridge access is again a problem. Further removal work with explosives is necessary to again provide protection for the gulls. Explosive ork will be performed, as before, by the Nati nal Guard.

The activity is exempt under CEQA, and a Notice of Exemption has been filed by the Department of Fish and Game pursuant to Section 15074(c) of Title 14 of the Cal. Adm. Code.

The activity is also helping to protect and maintain a segment of those significant environmental values (gulls) identified pursuant to P.R.C. 6370.1
