GENERAL PERMIT
PUBLIC AGENCY USE

APPLICANT: United States Bureau of Reclamation
2800 Cottage Way
Sacramento, California 95825

AREA, TYPE LAND AND LOCATION: Twenty parcels of submerged land in the bed of the Trinity River between Lewiston Dam and the confluence of Grass Valley Creek, Trinity County.

LAND USE: Restoration, and maintenance of 16 fish spawning riffles and 4 fish resting pools.

TERMS OF PROPOSED PERMIT: Initial period: 15 years from August 1, 1976.

CONSIDERATION: The public use and benefit with the State reserving the right at any time to set a monetary rental if the Commission finds such action to be in the State's best interest.

PREREQUISITE TERMS, FEES AND EXPENSES: Applicant is permittee of upland.

STATUTORY AND OTHER REFERENCES:
A. P.R.C.: Div. 6, Parts 1 & 2.
B. Cal. Adm. Code: Title 2, Div. 3.

OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:
1. The project involved the restoration of damaged pools and riffles along a 7-mile reach of the Trinity River between Lewiston Dam and Grass Valley Creek. The project has been completed.

2. The waiver of processing cost was negotiated prior to the Commission's June, 1979 action regarding collection of processing fees from public agencies.

3. This project is exempt from CEQA because the project involved the action by a regulatory agency for the protection of the environment.

Authority: 2 Cal. Adm. Code Section 2907 Class 8.

4. This project is situated on land identified as possessing environmental values in that the State Lands Commission stated all waterways under the Commission's jurisdiction have environmental significance. Staff finds that this project to be compatible with Commission policy.

IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT THE COMMISSION:

1. DETERMINE THAT AN EIR HAS NOT BEEN PREPARED FOR THIS ACTIVITY AS SUCH REPORT IS NOT REQUIRED UNDER THE PROVISION OF P.R.C. 21085, 14 CAL. ADM. CODE 15100 ET SEQ., AND 2 CAL. ADM. CODE 2907.
2. FIND THAT GRANTING OF THE PERMIT WILL HAVE NO SIGNIFICANT EFFECT UPON ENVIRONMENTAL CHARACTERISTICS IDENTIFIED PURSUANT TO SECTION 6370.1 OF THE P.R.C.
3. AUTHORIZE ISSUANCE TO THE UNITED STATES BUREAU OF RECLAMATION OF A 15-YEAR GENERAL PERMIT - PUBLIC AGENCY USE FROM AUGUST 1, 1976, IN CONSIDERATION OF THE PUBLIC USE AND BENEFIT WITH THE STATE RESERVING THE RIGHT AT ANY TIME TO SET A MONETARY RENTAL IF THE COMMISSION FINDS SUCH ACTION TO BE IN THE STATE'S BEST INTEREST FOR RESTORATION, AND MAINTENANCE OF 16 FISH SPAWNING RIFFLES AND 4 FISH RESTING POOLS ON THE LAND DESCRIBED ON EXHIBIT "A" ATTACHED BY REFERENCE MADE A PART HEREOF.

EXHIBIT "A"

Twenty parcels of land in the bed of the Trinity River, Trinity County, California, situated between Lewiston Dam and the Confluence of Grass Valley Creek, said parcels lying immediately beneath sixteen spawning riffles and four fish resting pools as shown on Exhibits 1 through 5 attached.

EXCEPTING THEREFROM any portion lying landward of the ordinary high water marks of the Trinity River.

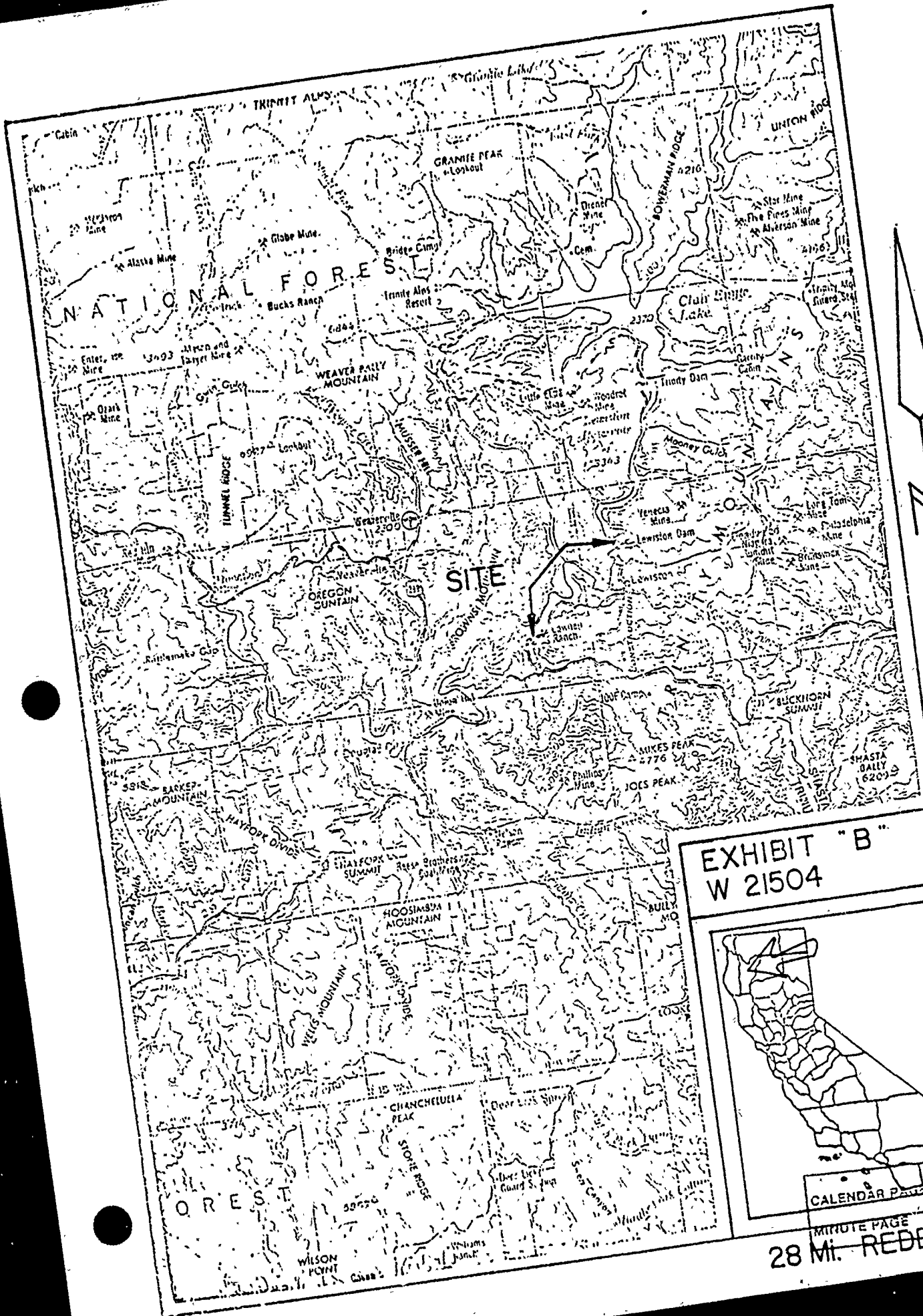
