GENERAL PERMIT
PUBLIC AGENCY USE

APPLICANT: California Department of Fish and Game
350 Golden Shore
Long Beach, California 90802

AREA, TYPE LAND AND LOCATION: A .30 acre parcel of submerged lands in Mono Lake, Mono County.

LAND USE: Construction, reconstruction and maintenance of a predator barrier fence to protect Negit Island gull rookery, an existing wild life habitat.

TERMS OF PROPOSED PERMIT: Initial period: 5 years from December 20, 1979.

CONSIDERATION: The public use and benefit.

BASIS FOR CONSIDERATION: 2 Cal. Adm. Code 2005.

PREREQUISITE TERMS, FEES AND EXPENSES: Filing fee and processing costs have been received.

STATUTORY OR OTHER REFERENCES:

- A. P.R.C.: Div. 6, Parts 1 & 2.
- B. Cal. Adm. Code: Title 2, Div. 3.
- C. Assembly Bill 367, Chapter 670, Statutes of 1979.

OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:

- 1. The annual rental value of the site is estimated to be \$100.
- 2. The formation of a land bridge between the upland and Negit Island has been created by the receding water level of Mono Lake. The bridge now provides

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land predators access to colony nesting birds which include California gulls. Negit Island is California's primary nesting site for gulls.

Various alternatives have been considered to protect the gull rookery from the threat of the upland predators. At their meeting in February 1978 and March 1979, the Commission authorized an emergency permit and a 1-year temporary use permit, respectively, to remove portions of the land bridge with explosives.

To date, the receding lake level has limited the success of protecting the island by this action. Additional engineering and soil analysis supports the finding that dredging will also be an infeasible protective measure. The subject project has been determined to be the most practicable action. On September 14, 1979, the Governor approved AB 367 (Chap. 670 Statutes of 1979) which allocates funds for the project and designates the legislative act as an urgency statute.

3. This project is exempt from CEQA because it is an emergency project. A notice of exemption has been filed by the Department of Fish and Game with the Secretary for Resources. Section 1507(c), 15074(a)(c) Cal. Adm. Code.
4. This project is situated on State land identified as possessing significant environmental values pursuant to P.R.C. 6370.1, and is classified in a use category, Class B, which authorizes Limited Use.

Staff has coordinated this project with those agencies and organizations which nominated the site as containing significant environmental values. They have found this project to be compatible with their nomination.

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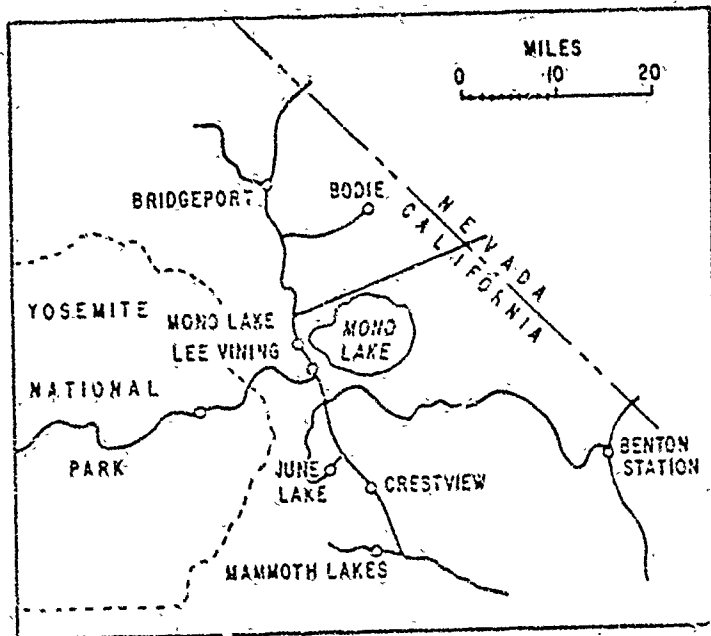
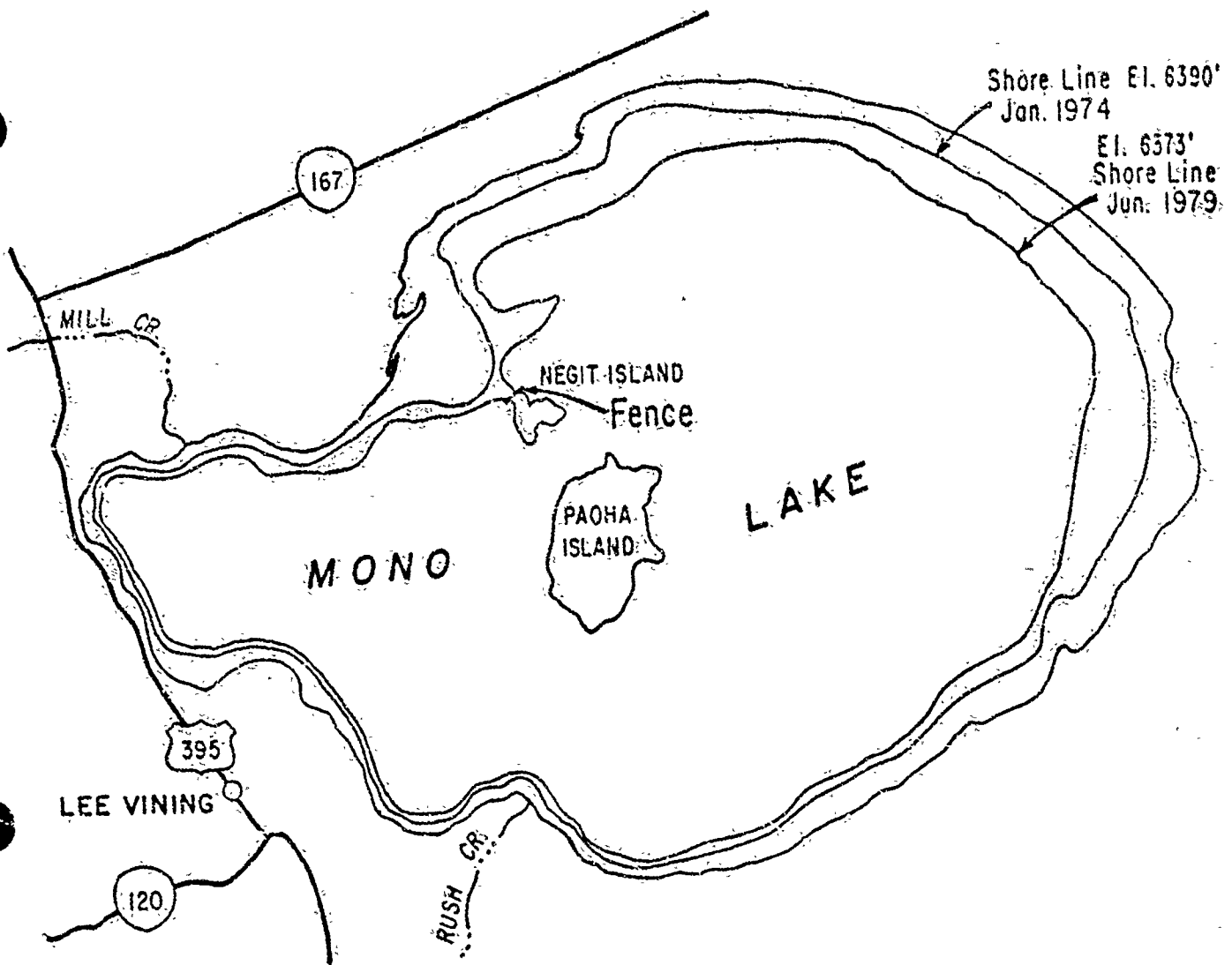
CALENDAR ITEM NO. 15. (CONTD)

This facility is subject to the jurisdiction of the California Department of Fish and Game, Lahontan Regional Water Quality Control Board, and the County of Mono. The proposed permit is conditioned on the approval of all agencies having jurisdiction.

IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT THE COMMISSION:

1. DETERMINE THAT AN EIR HAS NOT BEEN PREPARED FOR THIS ACTIVITY AS SUCH REPORT IS NOT REQUIRED UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF P.R.C. 21172, 14 CAL. ADM. CODE 15071 AND 2 CAL. ADM. CODE 2905(a).

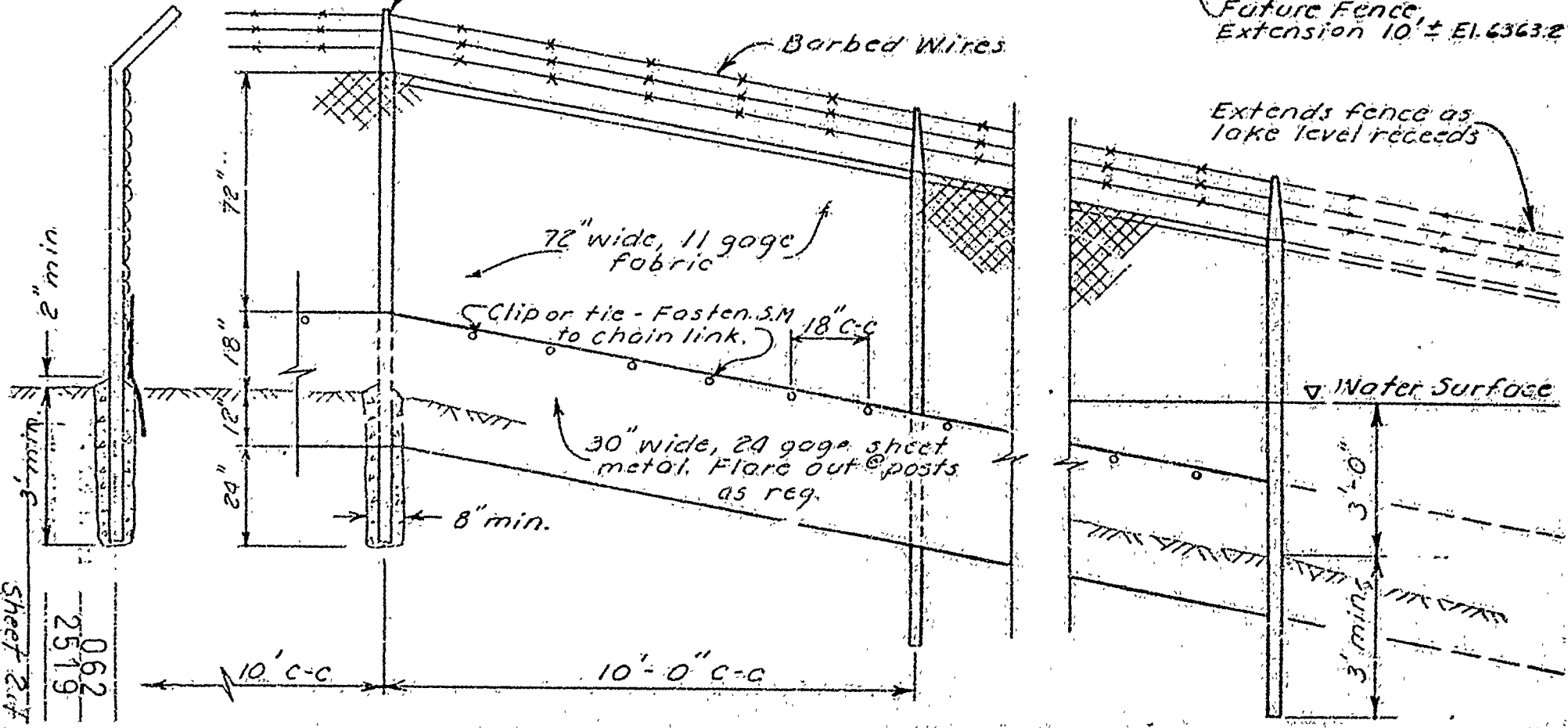

Description of Nature, Purpose and Beneficiaries of Project:

For the past two years the channel between Negit Island and the mainland was deepened by blasting to prevent a land bridge from forming. The effort was successful in 1978 but not in 1979. The lake is still receding and a land bridge is forming between Negit Island and the mainland. In 1979 the Legislature passed AB 367 appropriating \$250,000 to the Department of Fish and Game to provide the most feasible measures to protect the Negit Island gull rookery. The Department of Fish and Game has determined that a fence is the most feasible protective measure. The fence will be chain link, approximately 2,500 feet long, 6 feet high with a 3 strand barbed wire outrigger and a 30-inch sheet metal "skirt" at the bottom. The fence is necessary to eliminate access by predators this year. Copies of the exemptions for 1978 and 1979 blasting are attached.

Description of Nature, Purpose and Beneficiaries of Project:

Last year a channel was deepened by blasting between Negit Island and the mainland, at Mono Lake, to prevent a land bridge from forming. At the time there was still a few inches of water over this "bridge." The effort was a success for that nesting season. But, the lake is still receding, and land is now exposed at both ends of the channel. Blasting is again necessary to eliminate this access to predators during the nesting season. A copy of last year's "Notice of Exemption" is attached.
