## INFORMATIVE CALENDAR ITEM

In accordance with the Commission's delegation of authority to the Executive Officer on February 24, 1977 (Minute Item No. 32) to issue dredging permits of 10,000 cubic yards or less, to perform maintenance dredging on State-owned lands, the following applicant has been granted such permission:

APPLICANT:

State of California Department of Fish and Game P.O. Box 47 Yountville, California 94599

The permit provides for excavating a maximum of 3,000 cubic yards of sand, silt and gravel, excluding all other minerals including but not limited to, oil, gas and geothermal, from granted submerged lands (minerals reserved) in Lagunitas Creek at Bear Valley Creek, Marin County. Dredging is required to deepen a natural pool to promote proper oxygenation for spanning Salmon migrations.

Spoils will be placed at an upland public disposal area with no royalty charged. The permit also provides for a royalty of \$0.25 per cubic yard in the event materials are sold or placed on private property and is effective from September 1, 1981 through December 31, 1981.

In compliance with said delegation of authority, it has been determined that the following conditions have been met.


1. The proposed project is categorically exempt from the requirements of the CEQA Guidelines as maintenance dredging with spoils disposal in an approved disposal area.

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- 2. Issuance of the permit and the resultant project will have no significant adverse effect on the environment or the environmental characteristics identified pursuant to Section 6370.1 et seq. of the P.R.C.
- 3. The dredging amount will not exceed 10,000 cubic yards.
- 4. A charge per cubic yard will be assessed for spoil material that is deposited on private property or otherwise lost to future State benefit.
- 5. Approval of the project will be contingent upon approval by all pertinent State, federal and local agencies.

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A parcel of submerged land in the bed of Lagunitas Creek, Marin County, State of California, more particularly described as follows:

BEGINNING at Station No. 18 as shown on that certain map entitled "Map of the Boundary Between Sovereign Lands and the U.G.&L.G. Giacomini Property" recorded on November 8, 1961 in can "H", serial No. 35248, in the Office of the Marin County Recorder; thence the following 12 courses:

1. S 64° 39' 14" E 210.24 feet; N 86° 11' 10" E 150.33 feet; N 83° 56' 45" E 663.70 feet; S 82° 39° 25" E 200.00 feet; N 07° 305 35" E 67.71 feet; N 83° 10' 02" W 238.71 feet; 6.
