## APPROVAL OF PROPOSED STIPULATED JUDGMENT LINE RE MALINOWSKI V. STATE, Sagramento county superior court no. 267318

Casimer and Etta Malinowski sued the State Lands Commission in 1977 to quiet title to a portion of an island in the Sacramento River near the cown of Isleton. They claim that a 1948 stipulated judgment from a quiet title action between their predecessors and the State, which established a boundary between the privately owned portion of the island and the State-owned bed of the river, was a meander line and that the land which exists coday between that boundary line and the mean high tide line of the river belongs to them. The State claims that the prior stipulated judgment permanently fixed the boundary between State and private interests and, thus, the land in question, being waterward of the agreed liue, belongs to the State. The Sacramento County Superior Court granted partial summary judgment in favor: of the Malinowski's on this issue and the State will appea]. that ruling upon entry of final judgment.

The remaining issue in the case involves the causes of the formation of land on the island waterward of the 1948 stipulated judgment line. Because of the difficulty and expense involved in attempting to prove how the island acquired its present dimensions; the parties have stipulated co.a compromise boundary line which would take effect only if the Malinowski's preiril on the issue of the interpretation of the 1948 stipulated judgment line at the conclusion of all appeals. This compromise line, which has been jointly surveyed and desribed by the parties, will resolve this issue through a stipulated judgment and facilitate the State's appeal of the primary issue relating to the 1948 judgment.

The stipulation and the compromise boundary line as surveyed and described have been approved by staff and the Attorney General's office.
