AWARD OF A GEOTHERMAL RESOURCES LEASE OF RESERVED MINERAL INTERESTS, LAKE COUNTY

On June 24, 1981 the State Lands Commission authorized staff to offer 800 acres of State reserve mineral lands in Lake County for lease by competitive public bid for the extraction of geothermal resources. These lands were subsequently offered for lease on the basis of a net profits bid factor. In addition to the net profits payment the lease provided for the payment of a 12.5 percent royalty on gross revenue received for the sale of steam and an annual rental of \$1 per acre.

On October 1, 1981 three bids were received in response to a Notice of Intention published August 3 in the Santa Rosa Press Democrat. Central California Power Agency was the high bidder with a bid of 70 percent of the net profits. Based on a review of technical data cubmitted with this bid, it is the staff's opinion Central California Power Agency has the ability to explore and develop the subject parcel, and that this bid is acceptable.

Legal, technical and economic review of the bids have been made and it has been determined that:

- the Commission has complied with the 1. procedural requirements of the law; and
- 2. the bid submitted by Central California Power Agency conforms with the bid requirements specified in the proposal, the applicable provisions of law, and the rules and regulations of the commission.

Section 6912(b) of the P.R.C. provides that the surface landowner may, within ten days after notification by the Commission, submit a bid identical to the highest acceptable bid, in which case the Commission shall issue a lease to the surface landowner. If the surface landowner does not file such a bid, then the commission may proceed with the award of the bid to other than such surface landowner.

- 4. AUTHORIZE THE EXECUTIVE OFFICER TO EXECUTE A LEASE WITH THE SURFACE LANDOWNER IN THE EVENY THE SURFACE LANDOWNER MATCHES THE HIGHEST ACCEPTABLE BID WITHIN THE TIME PRESCRIBED BY P.R.C. SECTION 6912, OR, IN THE ALTERNATIVE, IF THE SURFACE LANDOWNER FAILS TO FILE THE BID WITHIN THE TIME PRESCRIBED BY P.R.C. 6912 AUTHORIZE THE EXECUTIVE OFFICER TO EXECUTE THE LEASE WITH THE CENTRAL CALIFORNIA POWER AGENCY.

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


