DREDGING PERMIT

In accordance with the Commission's Delegation of Authority to the Executive Officer for the issuance of dredging permits of 10,000 cubic yards or less, Minute Item 32, February 24, 1977, permission was granted on May 29, 1980, to excavate 5,000 cubic yards of material from State-owned submerged lands to the party named below. Because of unusually high-low water levels prohibiting use of tractors, the applicant requested, and the Executive Officer issued, an extension to the permit for:

The modification extends the terms of the permit from March 31, 1982 to December 31, 1982, specifies that all other terms, conditions and requirements of the original permit remain in full force and effect, and requires compliance with the permits, recommendations and limitations of all applicable federal, State and local agencies. The original permit allowed removal of 5,000 cubic yards from the State lands in the last natural bed of the Colorado River at Needles, San Bernardino County, with spoils to be placed on an adjacent peninsula between the lagoon to be dredged and the present river channel. No royalty will be assessed on material so deposited.

In compliance with said delegation of authority it has been determined that the following conditions have been met.

1. The proposed project is categorically exempt from the requirements of CEQA, pursuant to the provisions of Section 15104 of the CEQA Guidelines as a minor alteration to land with spoils disposal in an approved disposal area.

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2. Issuance of the permit and the resultant project will have no significant adverse effect on the environment or the environmental characteristics identified pursuant to Section 6370.1 et seq., of the P.R.C.
3. The dredging amount will not exceed 10,000 cubic yards.
4. No royalty will be charged for dredged material deposited as agreed upon in the original permit.
5. Approval of the project will be contingent upon approval by all pertinent State, federal and local agencies.
