DREDGING PERMIT MODIFICATION

APPLICANT:

Exxon Company, U.S.A. 3400 East Second Street Benicia, California 94510

AREA, TYPE LAND AND LOCATION:

Tide and submerged lands adjacent to applicant's

crude oil dock, Carquinez Strait, Solano

County.

LAND USE:

Continue to dredge a maximum of 80,000 cubic yards of sediment annually from dock area to maintain navigable depth, and spoil dredged material at an approved disposal site.

TERMS OF ORIGINAL PERMIT:

Initial period:

Five years and nine months

from March 25, 1976.

Royalty:

\$0.15 per cubic yard.

TERMS OF PROPOSED PERMIT MODIFICATION:

Initial period: Ten years from January 1,

1982.

Royalty of \$0.15 per cubic yard for spoils CONSIDERATION:

placed in public disposal sites; \$0.25 per cubic yard for materials sold, placed on privately owned property or used for private or commercial benefit, with the Stace reserving the right to fix a different

royalty on the fifth anniversary of the

permit.

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OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:

1. This project is exempt from CEQA because it is maintenance dredging with spoils to be deposited in an area approved by all applicable regulatory agencies.

Authority: Cal. Adm. Code, Title 14, Div. 6, Chapter 3, Section 15104 (Class 4).

2. This project is situated on State land identified as possessing significant environmental values pursuant to P.R.C. 6370.1, and is classified in a use category, Class C, which authorizes Multiple Use.

Staff review indicates that there will be no significant effect upon the identified environmental values. This is an existing operation for which no adverse comments have been received.

3. Staff has prepared a permit document which includes all the above provisions. Said document is on file in the offices of the Commission.

FURTHER APPROVALS REQUIRED:

United States Army Corps of Engineers, San Francisco Bay Conservation and Development Commission, and Regional Water Quality Control Board.

- 1. DETERMINE THAT AN ENVIRONMENTAL DOCUMENT HAS NOT BEEN PREPARED FOR THIS ACTIVITY, AS SUCH DOCUMENT IS NOT REQUIRED UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF P.R.G. 21084, 14 CAL. ADM. CODE 15100 ET SEQ., AND 2 CAL. ADM. CODE 2907.
- 2. FIND THAT GRANTING OF THE PERMIT MODIFICATION WILL HAVE NO SIGNIFICANT EFFECT UPON ENVIRONMENTAL CHARACTER-ISTICS IDENTIFIED PURSUANT TO SECTION 6370.1 OF THE P.R.C.

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3. AUTHORIZE THE STAFF TO ISSUE TO EXXON COMPANY, U.S.A.
THE DREDGING PERMIT MODIFICATION ON FILE IN THE OFFICES
OF THE COMMISSION: SAID PERMISSION SHALL BE ISSUED
IN CONSIDERATION OF ROYALTY FOR DREDGED MATERIALS OF
\$0.15 PER CUBIC YARD, PLACED IN AN APPROVED PUBLIC
DISPOSAL SITE; AND \$0.25 PER CUBIC YARD PLACED ON PRIVATE
PROPERTY, SOLD, OR USED FOR PRIVATE OR COMMERCIAL BENEFIT;
SAID PERMIT SHALL BE FOR A PERIOD OF TEN YEARS BEGINNING
JANUARY 1, 1982; SHALL PROVIDE FOR ROYALTY REVIEW ON
THE FIFTH ANNIVERSARY OF THE PERMIT MODIFICATION, AND
SHALL ALLOW THE DREDGING OF A MAXIMUM OF 80,000 CUBIC
YARDS ANNUALLY OF SAND, SILT, CLAY, AND GRAVEL, EXCLUDING
ALL OTHER MATERIALS INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO,
OIL, GAS AND GEOTHERMAL, FROM AN AREA OF TIDE AND SUBMERCED
LANDS IN CARQUINEZ STRAIT, SOLANO COUNTY; SAID AREA
IS DESCRIBED IN EXHIBIT "A" ATTACHED HERETO AND BY
THIS REFERENCE EXPRESSLY MADE A PART HEREOF. DREDGED
MATERIALS SHALL BE DEPOSITED AT UNITED STATES ARMY
CORPS OF ENGINEERS DISPOSAL SITE NO. 9, CARQUINEZ STRAIT.

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
