CESSION OF CONCURRENT CRIMINAL JURISDICTION

The United States Bureau of Prisons, acting through the United States Attorney General and the Federal Aviation Agency, acting through the United States Secretary of Transportation, have requested that the State of California cede concurrent criminal jurisdiction over the federal facilities at Boron, California, pursuant to Government Code Section 126. The subject parcels in San Bernardino County comprise the Federal Prison Camp at Boron and the Federal Aviation Agency Joint Surveillance Station at Boron. Concurrent criminal jurisdiction is needed before the United States and surbering federal investigation and the States are surbering federal investigation. States can authorize federal investigation and prosecution of criminal offenses occurring at the Boron facilities.
