PROSPECTIVE DEFENDANT:

AREA, TYPE LAND AND LOCATION:

A 1.13[±] acre parcel of tide and submerged land in Disappointment Slough, San Joaquin

County.

LAND USE:

Commercial marina known as Paradise Point

Marina.

BACKGROUND:

On or about September 24, 1979, Mr. Robert L. Breeze assumed the operation of Paradise Point Marina, a portion of which occupies State-owned land in Disappointment Slough. Prior to Mr. Breeze's operation, staff had negotiated a proposed lease with Mr. Robert

Torrey, which was not consumated.

By letter dated January 22, 1980, Mr. Breeze was advised to apply for a State Lands Commission lease pursuant to United States Army Corps of Engineers Public Notice 5191F, dated January 7, 1980.

By letter dated October 29, 1981, the General Manager of Paradise Point Marina was provided a set of lease application forms to be forwarded to Mr. Breeze.

By previous telephone calls and by letter of March 19, 1982, Mr. Jerry Kelly, Vice President of Playmate Resort Marinas and designated as leasing agent of Paradise Point Marina, was advised of the necessity to apply for a lease to use State-owned

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land in Disappointment Slough. (Playmate Resort Marinas appears to be the operator of several commercial marinas owned or controlled by Mr. Robert L. Breeze.)

By letter of April 30, 1982, to Mr. Robert Breeze, Mr. Jerry Kelly and Playmate Resort Marinas, the parties were notified by certified mail that they must apply for a lease to use State-owned land.

CURRENT SITUATION:

The Commission staff has diligently attempted to bring Mr. Breeze under lease for the use of State land, but has not been successful.

To date there has been no response from Mr. Breeze or his organization.
