APPROVAL OF EXTENSION OF PERMIT
TO PROSPECT FOR MINERALS
OTHER THAN OIL AND GAS
AND GEOTHERMAL RESOURCES, RIVERSIDE COUNTY

PERMITTEE: Harold Ladd Pierce

AREA, TYPE LAND AND LOCATION:
Approximately 56 acres of patented State
school land comprising a fractional portion
of the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$, and all of Lot 7, of Section
24, T3S, R3E, SBM in Riverside County.
Section 24 is situated in the San Gorgonio
Pass area near the confluence of the Whitewater
River and the San Gorgonio River, approxi-
mately seven miles northwest of Palm Springs.

MINERALS: Primarily feldspathic blow sand, as well
as all other minerals other than oil, gas
and geothermal resources. The State retained
100 percent of the minerals in the subject
area.

TERMS OF EXTENSION:
November 1, 1982 through October 31, 1983.

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PREREQUISITE ITEMS:

Application submitted by applicant.

Statutory fees have been submitted by applicant.

OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:

Prospecting Permit PRC 5905.2 was approved by the Commission on September 24, 1980, effective November 1, 1980. The permit granted the permittee an exclusive right for a period of two years to prospect for minerals other than oil and gas and geothermal resources. It was Harold Ladd Pierce's intent to determine if feldspathic sand exists in commercial quantities and, if so, to then propose a plan for its extraction.

The permittee has discovered feldspathic sands, mica, heavy minerals, and clay deposits under the issued permit.

The permittee is requesting a one-year extension of the permit to further correlate the feldspathic sand horizons on the State parcels with adjacent lands to determine the areal extent and chemical and physical variations of the sands, which may prove suitable for the commercial manufacture of ceramics. Further investigation of the clay deposit is planned. There have been no other applications or inquiries for the parcels to date.

Section 6891 of the P.R.C. provides that the Commission may, in its discretion, extend the term of any prospecting permit for a period not to exceed one year.

ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT:

Pursuant to Section 21000 of the P.R.C., Negative Declaration EIR ND No. 266 was prepared. The Negative Declaration was circulated and certified by the Commission on September 24, 1980, as being in com-

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pliance with CEQA and the State CEQA Guidelines. Certification included the determination that the proposed project would not have a significant effect on the environment. Upon discovery of commercially valuable minerals, the preferential right to convert the permit into a mineral extraction lease is subject to the preparation of an EIR covering the proposed lease operations and the discretion of the Commission after consideration of the material presented therein.

2. PURSUANT TO SECTION 6891 OF THE P.R.C., AUTHORIZE THE EXTENSION THROUGH OCTOBER 31, 1983, OF PROSPECTING PERMIT 5905.2, ISSUED TO HAROLD LADD PIERCE TO PROSPECT FOR ALL MINERALS OTHER THAN OIL AND GAS AND GEOTHERMAL RESOURCES; ALL TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF THE PERMIT ARE TO REMAIN IN FULL FORCE AND EFFECT.

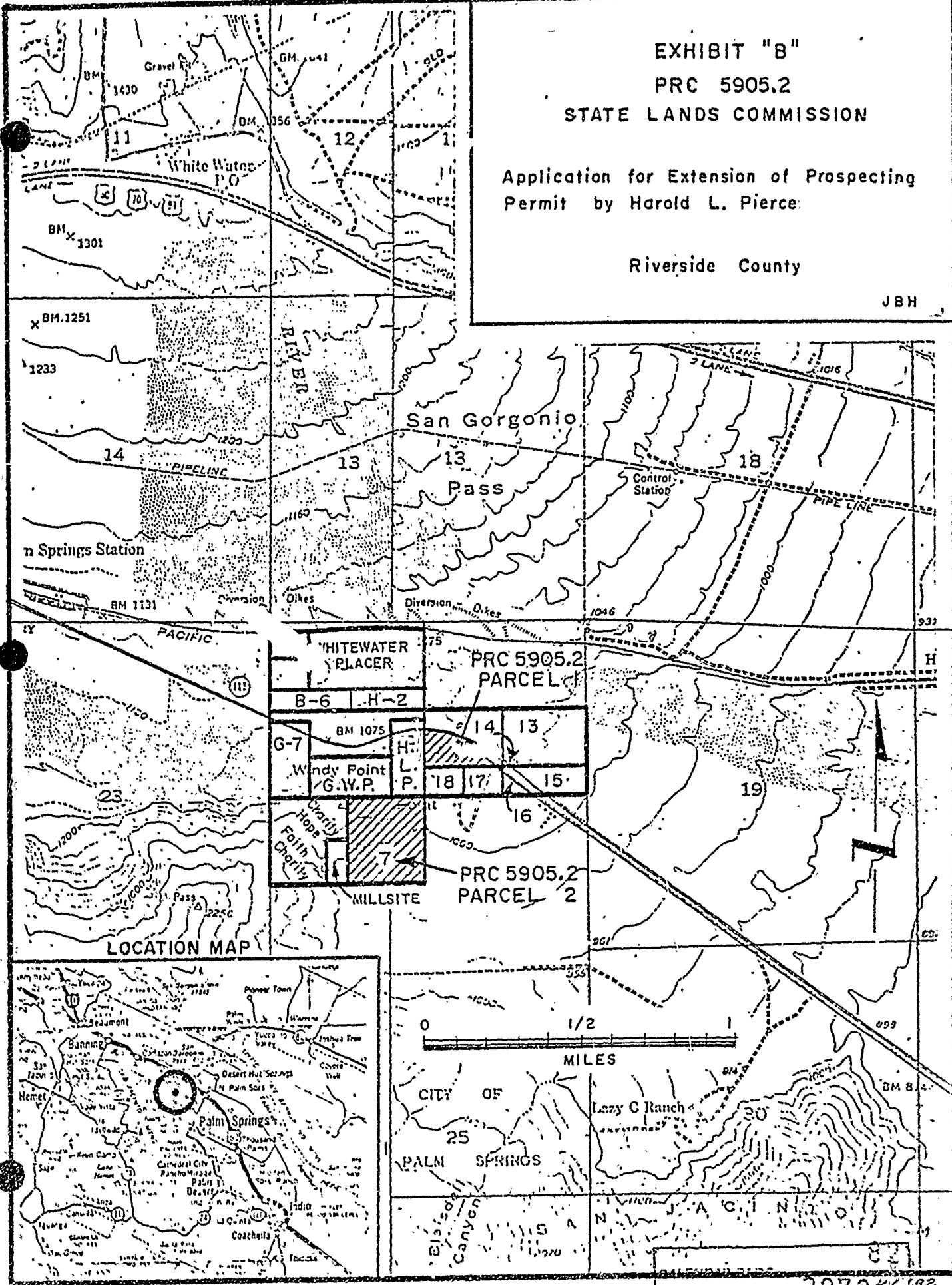
