OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:

- 1. The project is in an area where the location of water boundaries is not presently fixed or certain. The issuance of a permit will provide for project review and consent to the extent that such consent is required.
- 2. The project will consist of a cement spillway across the Kern River at the inlet of a canal which flows to Hart Lake, and an intake structure for controlling water flow. The goal of this work is to improve water circulation, to prevent algae growth, and to increase flows to keep irrigation pumps and domestic pumps in operation.
- The annual rental value of the site is estimated to be \$200.
- 4. A Negative Declaration was prepared and certified by the County of Kern, pursuant to CEQA and the State CEQA Guidelines. The project will not have a significant effect on the environment.
- 5. This project is situated on land identified as possessing environmental values in that the State Lands Commission stated all waterways under the Commission's jurisdiction have environmental significance. Staff finds this project to be compatible with Commission policy, and that it will not adversely affect the environment.
- 6. The Applicant and the staff have agreed to modify the standard indemnification section of the proposed permit, such that the Permittee shall not be liable for acts or omissions of persons other than Permittee's personnel.

Aiso a new canal or large pipeline approximately so feet long and a new control gate will be needed. The new canal or pipeline will connect the Hart Lake Canal to the pump canal.

- 4. The river channel and path will be returned to its original condition upon completion of construction.
- 5. A qualified Archeologist shall be consulted should construction reveal any archeological or historical sites.
