Crescent City, Del Norte County.

Selective salvage of artifacts from the British

freighter Queen Christina and salvage of

artifiacts and the remaining intact hull of the

Brother Jonathan, a passenger ship.

TERMS OF ORIGINAL PERMIT:

Initial period:

One year beginning

November 1, 1982.

Renewal options:

Extended for one year from

November 1, 1983.

Public liability insurance: Combined single

limit coverage of \$300,000.

Consideration:

\$675 - use of land area for one year. 25 percent of the net salvage value of \$25,000 or less, and 50 percent of the net salvage value in excess of \$25,000. Said sum shall be due on the first of the month following the sale and bear interest at the rate of 12 percent per annum if not paid within 15 days of

the due date.

TERMS OF PROPOSED PERMIT:

Initial period:

One year beginning November 1, 1984.

Public liability insurance: Combined single limit coverage of \$300,000.

CONSIDERATION:

\$675 - use of land area for one year. 25 percent of the net salvage value of \$25,000 or 1988, and 50 percent of the net salvage value in excess of \$25,000. Said sum shall be due on the first of the month following the sale and bear knterest at the rate of 12 percent per annum if not paid within 15 days of the due date.

OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:

The Brother Jonathan Company is requesting approval of a new permit because weather conditions are so unpredictable it is impossible to dive most of the year and they have been unable to complete the salvage operation. The conditions of the proposed permit will be identical to the original permit terms.

- 2. This activity involves lands identified as possessing significant environmental values pursuant to P.R.C. 6370, et seq. Based upon the staff's consultation with the persons nominating such lands and through the CEQA review process, it is the staff's opinion that the project, as proposed, is consistent with its use classification.
- 3. Pursuant to the Commission's delegation of authority and the State CEQA Guidelines (14 Cal. Adm. Code 15025), the staff has previously prepared a Proposed Negative Declaration identified as EIR ND 319, State Clearinghouse No. 82101301. Such Proposed Negative Declaration was prepared and circulated for public review pursuant to the provisions of CEQA and certified by the Commission on November 29, 1982. Staff believes that the document is still sufficient for this activity.

Based upon the Initial Study, the Proposed Negative Declaration and the comments received in response thereto, there is no substantial evidence that the project will have a significant effect on the environment. (14 Cal. Adm. Code 15074(b))

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

NEGATIVE DECLARATION

WP 6356

Salvage of the Queen Christina

This Negative Declaration is prepared pursuant to Section 15083, California Administrative Code, Title 14, Division 6 and is based upon an Initial Study pursuant to Sections 15080 and 15066 thereof.

Description

It is proposed to selectively salvage artifacts from a freighter that sank in 1907. The operation will take place near Crescent City, specifically off Point St. George in shallow water. It is expected that only a few days will be required for the project, although this is dependent on the weather. All items found will be catalogued and be the property of the State until their disposition is determined. The salvor intends to place all materials found and kept into a private museum for the maritime history of the northern California coast.

Determination

An Initial Study has been prepared and it is determined that the proposed project will not have a significant effect upon the environment.

- (1) The proposed project will have no cumulative impacts, or adverse effects on humans.
- (2) There will be minimal impacts upon fish and other marine organisms of the project environment.
- (3) Salvage of the Queen Christina, a British freighter, of a historical period is believed to be noncontroversial in terms of the historical elements of CEQA and the California History Plan. This determination rests upon the type of vessel, noucargo, and possible prior salvage. See attachment to Initial Study checklist.
- (4) Uses of public services, energy, and other resources are not applicable or are insignificant.
