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AMENDMENT OF DREDGING PERMIT

PRC 6446.1 TO EXTEND THE TERM OF DREDGING FROM ONE YEAR TO FIVE YEARS ENDING JUNE 22, 1988

APPLICANT:

Southwest Marine

AREA, TYPE LAND AND LOCATION:

State-owned submerged lands in the bed of San Diego Bay at the Southwest Marine Shipyard facility in the City of San Diego. San Diego County.

LAND USE:

The dredging of a total of 410,000 cubic yards of material of which 184,000 cubic yards of material is to be removed from lands under State jurisdiction to deepen the shippard area to allow for deeper draft vessels and larger drydocks.

Spoils will be deposited at the EPA authorized Disposal Site L.A. 5 located at 300 36' 50" N and 117° 20' 40" W in the Pacific Ocean.

RESUME OF PREVIOUS ACTION:

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The Commission on June 23, 1983 authorized issuance of Dredging Permit PRC 6446.1 to the applicant, Southwest Marine for a period of one year from June 23, 1983 for dredging of 184,000 cubic yards of sediment from the Southwest Marine Shipyard for re-modeling of the shipyard site to accommodate larger drydocks and vessels. Spoils disposal to be at the EPA approved Disposal Site L.A. 5 located at 300 36 50 N and 1170 20 40 West in the Pacific Ocean.

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CALENDAR ITEM NO. 15 (CONTID)

PROPOSED MODIFICATION:

- 1. Extend the term of the Dredging Permit PRC 6446.1 from one year to five years ending June 22, 1988, to allow the continued dredging of the project which, due to its completion in phases as old structures are removed and new ones installed, will progress uninterrupted through its time schedule,
- 2. All other conditions and terms of the existing Permit PRC 6446, I are to remain unchanged.

CONSIDERATION:

To avoid delays in the project which is in the interest of the public and commerce and to allow the completion of the project phases as tentatively scheduled.

OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION;

- 1. This activity involves lands identified as possessing significant environmental values pursuant to P.R.C. 6370 et seq. Based upon staff's consultation with the persons nominating such lands and through the CEQA review process, it is the staff's opinion that the project, as proposed, is consistent with its use classification.
- 2. Pursuant to the Commission's delegation of authority and the State CEQA Guidelines (14 Cal. Adm. Code 15061), the staff has determined that this activity is exempt from the requirements of the CEQA under the general rule that CEQA applies only to projects which have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment. The staff believes there is no possibility that this project may have such an effect.

- 3. At the outset of the proposed project, an EIR (SCH 8211405) was prepared and circulated by the Port of San Diego and such document was reviewed and considered by the SLG at its meeting of June 23, 1983, at which time, it was determined that the project, as mitigated, would not have a significant effect on the environment. Since adoption of that EIR, there have been no changes in the project or the environment to indicate any possibility that the project may have a significant effect on the environment.


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

Gentlemen:

Pursuant to your application dated February 7, 1983, and by the authorization of the State Lands Commission on June 23, 1983, you are hereby granted permission to dredge a maximum of 184,000 cubic yards of sand, silt, clay and gravel, excluding all other minerals, including but not limited to oil, gas and geothermal to maintain the channel from an area of tide and submerged lands in the Southwest Marine Snippard, San Diego Courty, as described and designated respectively in Exhibits A and B attached hereto, which are by this reference expressly made a part hereof. Said permission includes the right to deposit said batterial at the Environmental Protection Agency approved Disposal Situ L.A.-5 at 32 36 50 N. and 117 20 10 W. in

A royalty of \$0.15 per cubic yard will be assessed for material removed from State-owned land and blaced at the EPA approved disposal site and a royalty of \$0.25 per cubic yard shall be puid for material placed or private property or used for any private or commercial benefit.

Said permission is given on the condition that all dredging and spoils deposition shall be done in accordance with all applicable Federal, Scate and local government lews, rules and regulations. Said permission shall be effective from June 25, 1983 through sune 22, 1984

The permission to dredge the above-described lands is pased upon information presently available to the State

EXHIBIT O

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Lands Commission, and is given without survey or title determination. Such permission shall not be construed as fixing State land boundaries or as necessarily extablishing the extent of the State's claim to property in the area. The State warrants neither the title to the demised premises nor any right you may have to possession or quiet enjoyment.

Is is hereby agreed that the operations authorized under this permit shall be performed with diligence, in a good and workmanlike manner, and with the use of due the care and safety precautions.

It is further agreed that you shall submit reports substantiating the volume of materials dredged and any royalties due to the Commission on a quarterly basis, on agreed that you shall submit said forms on or before the cash permit quarter, together with payment for the royalty due on the volume removed during that quarter. The first the effective date of this permit, and overy three-month period thereafter shall be a permit quarter.

It is hereby agreed that, pursuant to Public Resources Code Section 6224, any installments of royalty accruing under the provisions of this permit that are not paid when due shall be subject to a five percent (32) penalty and shall bear interest at the rate of one purcent (12, per month from the date when the same was payable by the terms

It is agreed that you shall furnish the Commission with copies of final surveys or copies of any other computations used as a basis to verify dredge volumes within twenty-five (25) days of completion of the activity suthorized hereunder.

It is agreed that you shall indemnify, save harmless and, at the option of the State of California, defend said State, its officers, agent; and employeer, against any of any kind which may be asserted against or imposed upon the State of California or any of its officers, agents or employees by any third person or entity, arisin, out hereunder, or the use by you or your agents, employees or contractors, of the above described lands.

Without limiting the renerality of the foregoing, such indemnification shall include any claim, demand, cause

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of action or liability of any kind asserted against or impounded upon the State of California or any of its officers, agents or employees arising out of or connected with any alleged or actual violation by y u, your agents, employees or contractors of the property or contractual rights of or contractors of the property or contractual rights of any third person or antity. It is agreed that you shall, at the option of the Commission, procure and maintain liability insurance for the benefit of the State in an amount satisfactory to the Commission.

You agree to comply with the terms and conditions hereof, and you further agree that any violation thereof shall constitute grounds for termination of this permit and shall allow the Commission to pursue any other remedy available to it under the law. It is further agreed that this permit may be suspended, modified or terminated whenever the State Lands Commission deems such action to re in the best interests of the State, and that ro such action by the Commission shall be deemed to be a basis for any claim or cause of action for damages against the State, or any officer, employee or agency thereof.
