2. These activities involve lands identified as possessing significant environmental values pursuant to P.R.C. 6370, et seq. Based upon the staff's consultation with the persons nominating such lands and through the CEQA review process, it is the staff's opinion that the projects as proposed are consistent with the lands' use classification.

3. Lake Tahoe Application: The Commission at its meeting on November 27, 1978, suspended all leasing for new construction at Lake Tahoe, except for mooring buoys in designated areas. This action was taken pending completion of an EIP which addresses the cumulative impact of continued construction of piers in Lake Tahoe. Item A herein is for the continued use of an existing buoy in the lake, and therefore is not subject to the Commission's suspension of leasing activities for new construction.

4. All permits covering structures in Lake Tahoe will include a condition subsequent that if any structure authorized is found to be in nonconformance with the Tahoe Regional Planning Agency's Shorezone ordinance and if any alterations, repairs, or removal required pursuant to said ordinance are not accomplished within the designated time period, then the permit will be automatically terminated and the structures will be removed and the shorezone will be cleared pursuant to the ordinance.
