OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:

In 1978, the State Lands Commission 1. approved a month-to-month sublease granted by the City of San Clemente, to J. O. Carden, for a coin-operated telescope located on the City's municipal pier. Carden's Coin Telescopes is now operated by Mr. Carden's daughter and her spouse, Laura Carden and Gary L. Gardhouse. The City, based on a lengthy and successful relationship with Mr. Carden, has entered into a new month-to-month sublease with Mr. and Mrs. Gardhouse, and has further approved the installation of a second telescope on the pier. In compliance with the City's lease for the pier, it has requested Commission approval of the telescope sublease.

the staff has reviewed the terms and conditions of the sublease and found them to be consistent with the Commission's leasing practices. The new sublease is a month-to-month agreement, commencing April 20, 1988. The sublessees have agreed to pay a percentage rent equal to 40 percent of the amount of gross sales during each calendar year, as long as gross sales do not exceed \$10,000; should gross sales exceed \$10,000 during any calendar year, then sublessees shall pay a percentage rent equal to 50 percent of the amount of its gross sales during such year(s). Reports of gross sales, together with payment of percentage rental, shall be due to the City on the thirtieth day of each calendar Regardless of gross sales, month. sublessees shall pay a minimum rent of \$20 per month. The sublessees have agreed to indemnify the City, and to procure and maintain insurance coverage as follows:

- Policy of comprehensive public liability and property damage insurance not less than \$300,000 for injury or death of one or more persons, and not less than \$50,000 property damage (City is named as additional insured);
- b. Standard fire and extended coverage insurance covering the telescope equipment on the lease premises equal to 100 percent of replacement costs; and
- c. Workman's compensation insurance during the course of any construction, repair, and for alteration to the lease premises.
- At its June 30, 1938 meeting (Minute Item 4), the Commission approved the assignment of the bait and tackle sublease. In that transaction, the City

paid the required filing fee of \$25 and the processing expense of \$300. If it were not for the City's discussions with Commission staff, regarding an amendment to the lease relative to the sublease provision, it could have processed the subject telescope sublease at the same time, under one processing expense. For this reason, staff recommends that the processing expense for approval of this sublease be waived.

- This activity involves lands identified as 3. possessing significant environmental values pursuant to P.R.C. 6370, et seq. but will not affect those significant lands.
- Pursuant to the Commission's del'égation of 4. authority and the State CEQA Guidelines (14 Cal. Adm. Code 15061), the staff has determined that this activity is exempt from the requirements of the CEQA because the activity is not a "project" as defined by CEQA and the State CEQA Guidelines.


