OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:

- The subject Permit was initially entered a o between the Commission and the versity for a term of one year commencing May 1, 1981, for the operation and maintenance of an artificial bed for cultivation of giant kelp for experimental and educational purposes. By agreement, the Permit was extended by two successive one year terms through April 30, 1983, and again for two successive three-year terms through April 30, 1989. The University has informed staff of the Commission that when heavy weather associated with El Nino, and subsequent storms set in, there was a gradual detachment of the kelp, and in the course of time, all of it disappeared. most recent storms resulted in the complete loss of the remaining installation, including the marker buoy. This was confirmed by a detailed search of the area by engineering student divers. With the loss of the plantation, the University's long-term plans for trying artificial "planting" of the kelp are not possible, and the project will not be continued. The University has provided staff with an executed Lease Quitclaim Deed. Staff recommends acceptance of the Deed and termination of the Permit effective April 30, 1989.
- This activity involves lands identified as 2. possessing significant environmental values pursuant to P.R.C. 6370, et seq. but will not affect those significant lands.
- Pursuant to the Commission's delegation of authority and the State CEQA Guidelines (14 Cal. Code Regs. 15061), the staff has determined that this activity is exempt from the requirements of the CEQA because the activity is not a "project" as defined by CEQA and the State CEQA Guidelines.
