APPROVAL OF THE AWARD OF CRUDE OIL SALES CONTRACT
BY CITY OF LONG BEACH FOR CITY'S SHARE OF CRUDE OIL
PRODUCED FROM CERTAIN TRACTS WITHIN THE FAULT
BLOCK IV UNIT AND THE FAULT BLOCK V RANGER ZONE UNIT,
WILMINGTON OIL FIELD

On September 14, 1988, the State Lands Commission approved the significant specifications for and authorized the sale of crude oil by the City of Long Beach from tracts within the Fault Block IV Unit and the Fault Block V Ranger Zone Unit, Wilmington Oil Field, Los Angeles County. (See Exhibits "A", "B" and "C").

At present, the City of Long Beach has three crude oil sales contracts with three purchasers for oil allocated to the City from certain tideland tracts (listed in Exhibits "A", "B" and "C") within the Fault Block IV Unit and the Fault Block V Ranger Zone Unit.

A drilling and operating contract with the Termo Company will terminate on February 8, 1989, resulting in the City becoming the 100 percent working interest owner of the tracts listed on Exhibit "A". The City's interest in these tracts is approximately 70 barrels per day of 170 API gravity crude oil. Termo was paying the City a price equivalent to Chevron USA, Inc.'s posting in the Wilmington Oil Field.

On March 1, 1989, the crude oil sales contract with Mobil Oil Corporation for the City's working interest share of oil in tracts listed on Exhibit "B" will expire. The City's interest in these tracts is approximately 45 barrels per day of 170 API gravity crude oil. Mobil was paying the City a price equivalent to the average of the prices posted by Cheuron USA, Inc., Mobil Oil Corporation and Union Oil Company of California in the Wilmington Oil Field.

On May 1, 1989, the crude oil sales contract with Edgington Oil Company for the City's working interest share of oil in tracts listed on Exhibit "C" will expire. The City's interest in these tracts is approximately 165 barrels per day of 17° API gravity crude oil. Edgington is paying the City a bonus of \$0.365 per barrel above a base price defined as the highest price posted forlike crude oil on the day of delivery in the Wilmington, Long Beach (Signal Hill), Huntington Beach and Inglewood Oil Fields among the postings of Chevron USA, Inc., Mobil Oil Corporation and Union Oil Company of California.

The City combined all three contracts into one contract, amounting to approximately 280 barrels per day of 17° API gravity crude oil. The contract's term is from February 1, 1989 until February 1, 1990. However, delivery of the oil from the tracts listed in Exhibit "A" will begin on February 8, 1989, delivery of the oil from the tracts listed in Exhibit "B" will begin on March 1, 1989 and delivery of the oil from the tracts listed in Exhibit "C" will begin on May 1, 1989.

A Notice Inviting Bids was published in <u>The Wall Street Journal</u> (Western Edition) and <u>The Oil Daily</u> on October 4, 5, 6, 1988 and October 4, 6, 1988 respectively. Bids were received and opened on October 26, 1988. Exhibit "D" shows the results of the bidding.

Fiscal and legal reviews of the submitted bid material were done by the City of Long Beach and SLC Auditing and Legal Units respectively. Based on the results of these reviews the highest responsible bidder has been identified on Exhibit "D".

Under Section 10(a) of Chapter 29, Statutes of 1956, 1st E.S., the State Lands Commission must approve any contract involving the disposition of crude oil from the Long Beach Tidelands.

OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:

1. Pursuant to the Commission's delegation of authority and the State CEQA Guidelines (14 Cal. Code Regs. 15061), the staff has determined that this activity is exempt from the requirements of the CEQA because the activity is not a "project" as defined by CEQA and the State CEQA Guidelines. Authority: P.R.C. 21065 and 14 Cal. Code Regs. 15378.
