GENERAL PERMIT - PUBLIC AGENCY USE

APPLICANT:

California Department of Fish and Game

1416 Ninth Street

Sacramento, California 95814

AREA, TYPE LAND AND LOCATION:

A one-acre parcel of submerged land located in the Merced River below the Crocker-Huffman Dam,

near Snelling, Merced County.

LAND USE:

Placement of gravel and retainment weirs for

the purpose of salmon spawning habitat.

TERMS OF PROPOSED PERMIT:

Initial period:

Twenty years beginning

September 1, 1989.

Consideration:

The public use and benefit with the State reserving the right at any time to set a monetary rental if the

Commission finds such action to be in the State's best

interest.

APPLICANT STATUS:

Applicant is permittee of the upland.

STATUTORY AND OTHER REFERENCES:

#### OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:

 Pursuant to the Commission's delegation of authority and the State CEQA Guidelines (14 Cal. Code Regs. 15061), the staff has determined that this activity is exempt from the requirements of the CEQA as a categorically exempt project. The project is exempt under Class 4, Minor Alteration to Land, 14 Cal. Code Regs 15304(d).

Authority: P.R.C. 21084 and 14 Cal. Code Regs. 15300.

- The project site is located just downstream from the Crocker-Huffman Dam and adjacent to the Merced River Fish Facility, near the town of Snelling.
- 3. The project involves excavating large cobble from the streambed to be placed away from the stream above the high water level. Permission to dispose of the cobble at the upland disposal site has been obtained from the adjacent land owner, and it will not be sold.

Six rock gravel retainment weirs will be placed across the streambed and washed gravel will be placed behind the retainment structures to form suitable salmon spawning riffles.

- During construction, no native material will be pushed into or otherwise disposed of into the river.
- 5. The Applicant has requested that the required fees be waived due to the fact that project conforms to the Governor's mandate to increase salmon production throughout the State. The project will provide additional high quality salmon spawning gravel which will benefit the salmon resource and ultimately the public.

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- The annual rental value of the site is \$50 which is the minimum rental for this type of permit.
- 7. This activity involves lands identified as possessing significant environmental values pursuant to P.R.C. 6370, et seq. Based upon the staff's consultation with the persons nominating such lands and through the CEQA review process, it is the staff's opinion that the project, as proposed, is consistent with its use classification.

United States Army Corps of Engineers, California State Reclamation Board, and Merced Irrigation District.

#### IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT THE COMMISSION:

- FIND THAT THE ACTIVITY IS EXEMPT FROM THE REQUIREMENTS OF THE CEQA PURSUANT TO 14 CAL. CODE REGS. 15061, AS A CATEGORICALLY EXEMPT PROJECT, CLASS 4, MINOR ALTERATION TO LAND, 14 CAL. CODE REGS. 15304(d).
- 2. FIND IT TO BE IN THE STATE'S BEST INTEREST TO WAIVE ALL REQUIRED FEES.
- 3. AUTHORIZE ISSUANCE TO CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME OF A 20-YEAR GENERAL PERMIT PUBLIC AGENCY USE BEGINNING SEPTEMBER 1, 1989; IN CONSIDERATION OF THE PUBLIC USE AND BENEFIT WITH THE STATE RESERVING THE RIGHT AT ANY TIME TO SET A MONETARY RENTAL IF THE COMMISSION FINDS SUCH ACTION TO BE IN THE STATE'S BEST INTEREST; FOR THE PLACEMENT OF GRAVEL AND RETAINMENT WEIRS ON THE LAND DESCRIBED ON EXHIBIT "A" ATTACHED AND BY REFERENCE MADE A PART HEREOF.

EXCEPTING THEREFROM any portion lying landward of the ordinary low water mark of the Merced River.
