Representatives of the Marina and Recreation Association which represents the owners of marina and other developments located on the State's lands have asked to address the Commission at its June meeting on issues of concern to their membership. These issues involve the rent charged by the Commission and the methods used by the staff to set the rent for the Commission's leases. The Association has also expressed concern about the potential future actions of the Commission which could result in the Commission acquiring ownership of certain improvements constructed by lessees at the end of the term of the original lease.

Provisions within the standard terms and conditions of the Commission's lease provide for the adjustment of the annual rent during the lease term. They also provide that the State may elect to take ownership of the improvements located on leased areas at the end of the lease term. These provisions have been a standard part of the Commission's leases for a long period of time and are only now coming into play because leases are reaching the end of their original term, or are at the point when it is profitable for the original lessees to sell the leasehold.

At the Commission's direction, staff will continue to work with the Association to develop a better understanding of the Commission's rules, regulations, and policy concerning the operation of the Commission's leases.
