DREDGING PERMIT

APPLICANT: Pacific Réfining Co. P. O. Box S& Hercules, California 94547

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AREA, TYPE LAND AND LOCATION: Tide and submerged lands in San Pablo Bay at Hercules, Contra Costa County.

LAND USE: Drector a maximum 200,000 cubic yards of mate-ial to maintain a navigable depth at the existing Pacific Refining Co. marine terminal and berthing area.

The Applicant has proposed disposal of the dredged material at the San Pablo Bay, Corps' EPA-approved Disposal Site SF-10.

TERMS OF PROPOSED PERMIT: Initial Period:

One year beginning November 1, 1990.

Royalty: No charge for aquatic disposal.

Additional Fee: A fee of \$0.25 per cubic yard for any dredged material disposed of at any site in San Francisco Bay, including but not limited to SF-10, to offset cost of studies necessary to develop non-Bay disposal sites for future use.

OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:

- The existing berthing area occupies lands 1. under State Lands Commission (SLC) jurisdiction. A lease authorizing use of the lands has been issued by the SLC to Pacific Refining.
- 2. Water quality testing performed pursuant to the Corps of Engineers and California Regional Water Quality Control Board permitting requirements found the materials to be suitable for disposal at SF-10 as proposed.
- Questions have been raised about continuing 3. to dispose of dredged material in San Francisco Bay. It is anticipated the currently approved in-Bay sites will reach capacity within ten years. In recognition of the need to develop other alternatives, a fee will be charged as a condition to the proposed permit to be deposited in a fund to offset the cost of needed studies.
- N finding of No Significant Impact (FONSI) 4. was prepared and adopted for this project by the Corps. The document was circulated for public review as broadly as State and local law requires and notice was given meeting the standards in 14 Cal. Code Regs. 15072(a). Therefore, pursuant to 14 Cal. Code Regs. 15225, the staff recommends the use of the federal FONSI in place of the Negative Declaration,

NO ROYALTY SHALL BE CHARGED FOR MATERIAL DISPOSED OF AT THE APPROVED AQUATIC DISPOSAL SITE. A ROYALTY OF \$0.25 PER CUBIC YARD SHALL BE CHARGED FOR ANY MATERIAL SOLD OR USED FOR COMMERCIAL PURPOSES. A FEE OF \$0.25 WILL BE CHARGED FOR EACH CUBIC YARD OF DREDGED MATERIAL PLACED AT IN-BAY DISPOSAL SITES, TO BE PLACED IN A SEPARATE FUND TO OFFSET COSTS OF STUDIES NECESSARY TO IDENTIFY AND ANALYZE ALTERNATIVE DISPOSAL SITES. THE PERMITTED ACTIVITY IS CONTINGENT UPON THE APPLICANT'S COMPLIANCE WITH APPLICABLE PERMITS, RECOMMENDATIONS, AND LIMITATIONS ISSUED BY FEDERAL, STATE, AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT AGENCIES.

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
