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> REQUEST FOR EXEMPTION FROM COMPETITIVE BID PROCEDURES FOR A LONDF IL GAS LEASE AGREEMENT ON COUNTY PROPERTY. SACRAMENTO COUNTY

APPLICANT:

County of Sacramento Department of Public Works Solid Waste Management Division 9700 Goethe Road, Suite E Sacramento, California 95827-3500

AREA, TYPE LAND AND LOCATION:

The Sacramento County Kiefer Landfill is a 650 acre parcel of county land approximately 15 miles southeast of the City of Sacramento near the intersection of Kiefer Boulevard and Grant Line Road, Sacramento County, T&N. R7E Sections 22, 26, 27, 35.

The Sacramento County Kiefer Landfill is located approximately 15 miles southeast of the City of Sacramento near the intersection of Kiefer Boulevard and Grant Line Road. landfill opened in 1967 and presently has over eight million tons of municipal refuse in place. Presently, the site receives approximately 650,000 tons of municipal solid waste annually. This is expected to increase to over 900,000 tons per year when the City of Sacramento joins the operation in 1992.

The Kiefer Landfill is classified as a Class III (new classification) solid waste disposal site. The site is owned

and operated by the Sacraments County and is open 365 days per year. The permitted area is 650 acres and the current landfill operating area is approximately 250 acres. The existing operating area is approximately 100 feet. The landfill maximum depth of fill is approximately 100 feet. The landfill design provides an estimated capacity of 76 million yards of (60 million cubic yards of refuse and 16 million cubic yards of (60 million cubic yards of the stimated site life of 25 to 31 years (2015 through cover). An estimated site life of 25 to 31 years (2015 through cover) assumes a three percent annual waste generation growth rate.

Landfill gas (LFG) generated and produced by land filled waste has potential as an energy source. Sacramento County desires to convert LFG at the Kiefer Landfill into a marketable product.

Sacramento County has requested proposals to develop an LFG recovery system at the county landfill. The county seeks a third-party development of the LFG system. The selected firm shall provide all services necessary to produce a working project including: engineering, design, permitting, environmental evaluation, financing, installation of recovery environmental evaluation, financing, and operation of the LFG system.

The project economics are based on a 20-year life expectancy with a beginning production of 1.6 MMCFD 1000 BTU gas escalating to 2.5 MMCFD. Sacramento County will receive a royalty of ten percent (10%) of the gross gas sales revenue and a site lease rental based on the installed gas processing a site lease rental based on the installed gas processing capability (initially estimated at \$120,000 per year). The capability (initially estimated at \$120,000 per year) on the county's initial annual revenue is estimated to be \$309,000 in county's initial annual revenue is estimated to be \$309,000 in 1991 and increasing to \$1,000,000 in 2010.

STATUTORY AND OTHER REFERENCES:

P.R.C. Section 7052 states in part:

"The State Lands Commission may in its discretion exempt particular leases or operating agreements from the procedure required by this section and Section 7053" --- "where by (competitive bidding procedures) --- "where by reason of the small size of the property or reason of the small or imminent, such procedure drainage, actual or imminent, such procedure would in the judgment of the State Lands Commission in the particular case be impractical".

Staff has reviewed the request of Sacramento County for an exemption from competitive bid procedures for a Landfill Gas Agreement on county property and has determined that it would be impractical for Sacramento County to follow the competitive public bidding procedures for this project as outlined in section 7052 and 7053 of the California P.R.C.
