AUTHORIZE, AS BOTH STATE LANDS COMMISSION AND
SCHOOL LAND BANK TRUSTEE, OFFER OF SALE OF A PARCEL
OF STATE SCHOOL LAND IN KERN COUNTY

PARTY:

Pursuant to P.R.C. 8700 (School Land Bank Act) and the School Land Management Study, staff is identifying parcels of land scattered throughout the State that have a possible highest and best use for sale for surface development. Staff has made a preliminary determination that a parcel in Kern County fits within the above-mentioned criteria.

Staff proposes that the Commission authorize offering the property for sale by competitive bid. The minimum bid would be the appraised value and any associated costs incurred in preparing the sale.

Final bids on the property will be presented to the Commission for approval and acceptance.

OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:

1. Pursuant to the Commission's delegation of authority and the State CEQA Guidelines (14 Cal. Code Regs. 15061), the staff has determined that this activity is exempt from the requirements of the CEQA as a statutorily exempt project. The project is exempt because it involves an action taken pursuant to the School Land Bank Act, P.R.C. 8700, et seq.

Authority: P.R.C. 8710.

2. The proposed sale involves land identified by Department of Fish and Game as possessing significant environmental values, Desert Tortoise and Mojave Ground Squirrel, pursuant to P.R.C. 6370, et seq. The property has been surveyed for Desert Tortoise, using U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service methodologies and no Desert Tortoise or tortoise sign was observed. Potential impacts to the State-listed threatened Mojave ground squirrel and any other sensitive wildlife species will be determined through the CEQA process if a purchaser of the property subsequently decides to develop it.

The Department of Fish and Game has been consulted and does not oppose the sale.

IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT THE COMMISSION:

1. FIND THAT THE ACTIVITY IS EXEMPT FROM THE REQUIREMENTS OF THE CEQA PURSUANT TO 14 CAL. CODE REGS. 15061 AS A STATUTORILY EXEMPT PROJECT PURSUANT TO P.R.C. 8710, AN ACTION TAKEN PURSUANT TO THE SCHOOL LAND BANK ACT, P.R.C. 8700, ET SEQ.
2. AUTHORIZE THE STAFF TO OFFER FOR SALE, BY COMPETITIVE BID, THE LAND DESCRIBED ON EXHIBIT "A" ATTACHED AND BY REFERENCE MADE A PART HEREOF. SUBSEQUENT COMMISSION ACTION, IN CONFORMANCE WITH APPLICABLE LAWS, RULES, AND REGULATIONS WILL BE REQUIRED TO ACCEPT BIDS, APPROVE ANY SALE, AND ISSUE A PATENT.

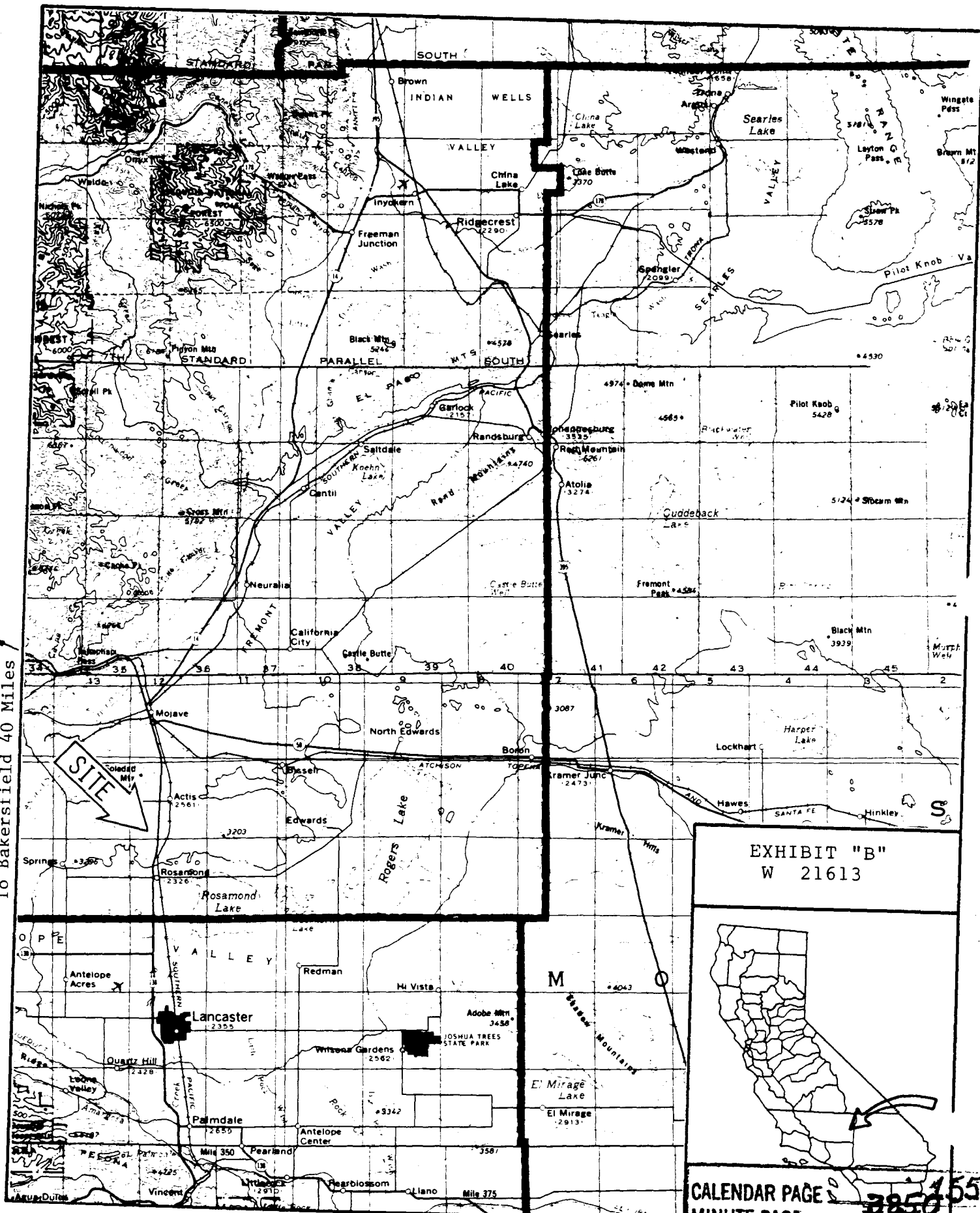
