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ACCEPTANCE OF A QUITCLAIM DEED AND TERMINATION OF GENERAL LEASE - RIGHT OF WAY USE

LESSEES:

C. Stuart Welch and Joyce Welch P.O. Box 613

La Conner, Washington 98257

AREA, LAND TYPE, AND LOCATION:

0.25 acres, more or less, of sovereign lands in Tomales Bay, near the town of Marshall, Marin County.

AUTHORIZED USE:

Use and maintenance of a two-inch diameter PVC water intake line and marker buoy.

LEASE TERM:

20 years, beginning April 1, 1997.

CONSIDERATION:

\$150 per year, with the State reserving the right to fix a different rent periodically during the lease term, as provided in the lease.

SPECIFIC LEASE PROVISIONS:

Insurance:

Liability insurance: Combined single limit coverage of no less than \$300,000.

Bond:

\$2,000 surety bond.

OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:

1. On May 12, 1997, the California State Lands Commission authorized a General Lease - Right of Way Use PRC 7952.1, effective April 1, 1997, for a term of 20 years to C. Stuart and Joyce Welch for the use and maintenance of a two-inch diameter PVC water intake line and marker

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buoy in Tomales Bay. The authorized improvements were utilized to supply bay water for an upland wet storage system used in the marketing of locally grown shellfish. On August 18, 1998, staff was notified by the Lessees that they had ceased operation of the wet storage system and requested their lease with the Commission be terminated. Staff has received written confirmation from the upland owner that the authorized improvements have been removed from the lease premises.

 Pursuant to the Commission's delegation of authority and the State CEQA Guidelines (Title 14, California Code of Regulations, section 15061), the staff has determined that this activity is exempt from the requirements of the CEQA because the activity is not a "project" as defined by the CEQA and the State CEQA Guidelines.

LAND DESCRIPTION

Two parcels of tide and submerged lands lying in the bed of Tomales Bay, Marin County, California, said parcels lying immediately beneath and adjacent to a two inch intake pipe and marker buoy, said parcels are situated adjacent to and westerly of that parcel of land described in that Grant Deed recorded August 5, 1954, in Book 880, Page 500, Official Records of Marin County, said parcels more particularly described as follows:

Parcel 1: Intake Pipe

A strip of land ten feet in width lying five feet on each side of the following described two inch PVC pipe, beginning at a pump house situated on the land described in the above mentioned grant deed, thence in a westerly direction 880 feet more or less to the end of said pipe and the end of strip.

Parcel 2: Marker Buoy

A circular parcel of land having a diameter of fifty feet, the radius point of said parcel lying 880 feet more or less westerly of the above described pump house and at the westerly end of above described PVC pipe.

EXCEPTING THEREFROM any portion lying landward of the ordinary high water mark of Tomales Bay.

ALSO EXCEPTING THEREFROM those interests-in-land that might have passed by virtue of the patent issued to James W. Cochrane on February 19, 1947 for the land described in Tideland Location No. 241, Marin County, California.
