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DREDGING LEASE

APPLICANT:

Port of San Francisco Ferry Building San Francisco, California 94111

AREA, LAND TYPE, AND LOCATION:

Granted sovereign lands with minerals reserved in San Francisco Bay at the Port of San Francisco, City and County of San Francisco.

AUTHORIZED USE:

Original authorization was to dredge a maximum of 422,400 cubic yards of material to maintain a navigable depth. This amendment will increase the amount of material to be dredged to a maximum of 1,352,153 cubic yards. Dredged material will be disposed of at the United States Army Corps of Engineers approved upland site and Alcatraz Disposal Site (SF-11).

LEASE TERM:

Five years, two months, beginning July 11, 1997; through September 30, 2002 to coincide with the United State Army Corps of Engineers permit.

CONSIDERATION:

No royalty will be charged for aquatic disposal; \$0.25 per cubic yard will be charged for any material used for private benefit or for commercial sale purposes.

OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:

1. Pursuant to the Commission's delegation of authority and the State CEQA Guidelines (Title 14, California Code of Regulations, section 15061), the staff has determined that this activity is exempt from the requirements of the CEQA as a categorically exempt project. The project is exempt under Class 4, Minor alterations to Land; Title 14, California Code of Regulations, section 15304(g).

AUTHORIZE THE ISSUANCE OF A DREDGING LEASE TO THE PORT OF SAN FRANCISCO BEGINNING JULY 11, 1997: THROUGH SEPTEMBER 30, 2002, FOR A TERM OF FIVE YEARS, TWO MONTHS, FOR DREDGING A MAXIMUM OF 1,352,153 CUBIC YARDS OF MATERIAL AT THE PORT OF SAN FRANCISCO TO MAINTIAN A NAVIGABLE DEPTH. DREDGED MATERIALS WILL BE DISPOSED OF AT THE UNITED STATES ARMY CORPS OF ENGINEERS APPROVED UPLAND SITE AND ALCATRAZ DISPOSAL SITE (SF-11). SUCH PERMITTED ACTIVITY IS CONTINGENT UPON APPLICANT'S COMPLIANCE WITH APPLICABLE PERMITS. RECOMMENDATIONS. OR LIMITATIONS ISSUED BY FEDERAL. STATE AND LOCAL GOVERNMENTS. NO ROYALTY SHALL BE CHARGED AS THE PROEJCT WILL RESULT IN A PUBLIC BENEFIT: \$0.25 PER CUBIC YARD SHALL BE CHARGED FOR ANY MATERIAL USED FOR PRIVATE BENEFIT OR COMMERCIAL SALE PURPOSES.
