DREDGING LEASE

APPLICANT:

Big Valley Band of Pomo Indians
P.O. Box 430
2726 Mission Rancheria Road
Lakeport, CA 95453

AREA, LAND TYPE, AND LOCATION:

Legislatively granted sovereign lands, with minerals reserved to the State,
in Clearlake, Lake County.

AUTHORIZED USE:

Dredge a maximum of 5,000 cubic yards from Clearlake to develop and
maintain a community marina and "botel" in conjunction with a larger
upland project. Disposal of dredged material to be located at a United
States Army Corps of Engineers approved upland disposal site located on
the Big Valley Rancheria.

LEASE TERM:

Five years, beginning December 1, 2003 through November 30, 2008.

CONSIDERATION:

No royalty will be charged for disposal of dredged material; a minimum of
\$0.25 per cubic yard will be charged for any material used for private
benefit or commercial sale purposes.

OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:

1. This activity is part of a larger dredging project to dredge a total of
95,000 cubic yards of material from Clearlake. The Big Valley Band of
Pomo Indians proposes to construct a community marina and "botel"
on approximately 6 acres of land within an approximate 9.4 acre parcel
of land adjacent to Clearlake that is contained within the Rancheria.
The majority of the dredging activity will occur on lands outside of

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CSLC jurisdiction. Of the total volume to be dredged, 5,000 cubic yards is within the CSLC jurisdiction in Clearlake.

2. A Mitigated Negative Declaration and Mitigation Monitoring Program were prepared and adopted for this project by Lake County Community Development. The California State Lands Commission's staff has reviewed such document.
3. This activity involves lands identified as possessing significant environmental values pursuant to Public Resources Code sections 6370, et seq. Based upon the staff's consultation with the persons nominating such lands and through the CEQA review process, it is the staff's opinion that the project, as proposed, is consistent with its use classification.

A COMMUNITY MARINA AND "BOTEL". DISPOSAL OF

DISPOSAL SITE LOCATED ON THE BIG VALLEY RANCHERIA.
SUCH PERMITTED ACTIVITY IS CONTINGENT UPON
APPLICANT'S COMPLIANCE WITH APPLICABLE PERMITS,
RECOMMENDATIONS, OR LIMITATIONS ISSUED BY FEDERAL,
STATE AND LOCAL GOVERNMENTS. NO ROYALTY SHALL BE
CHARGED FOR DISPOSAL OF DREDGED MATERIAL; A
MINIMUM OF \$0.25 PER CUBIC YARD SHALL BE CHARGED
FOR ANY MATERIAL USED FOR PRIVATE BENEFIT OR
COMMERCIAL SALE PURPOSES.

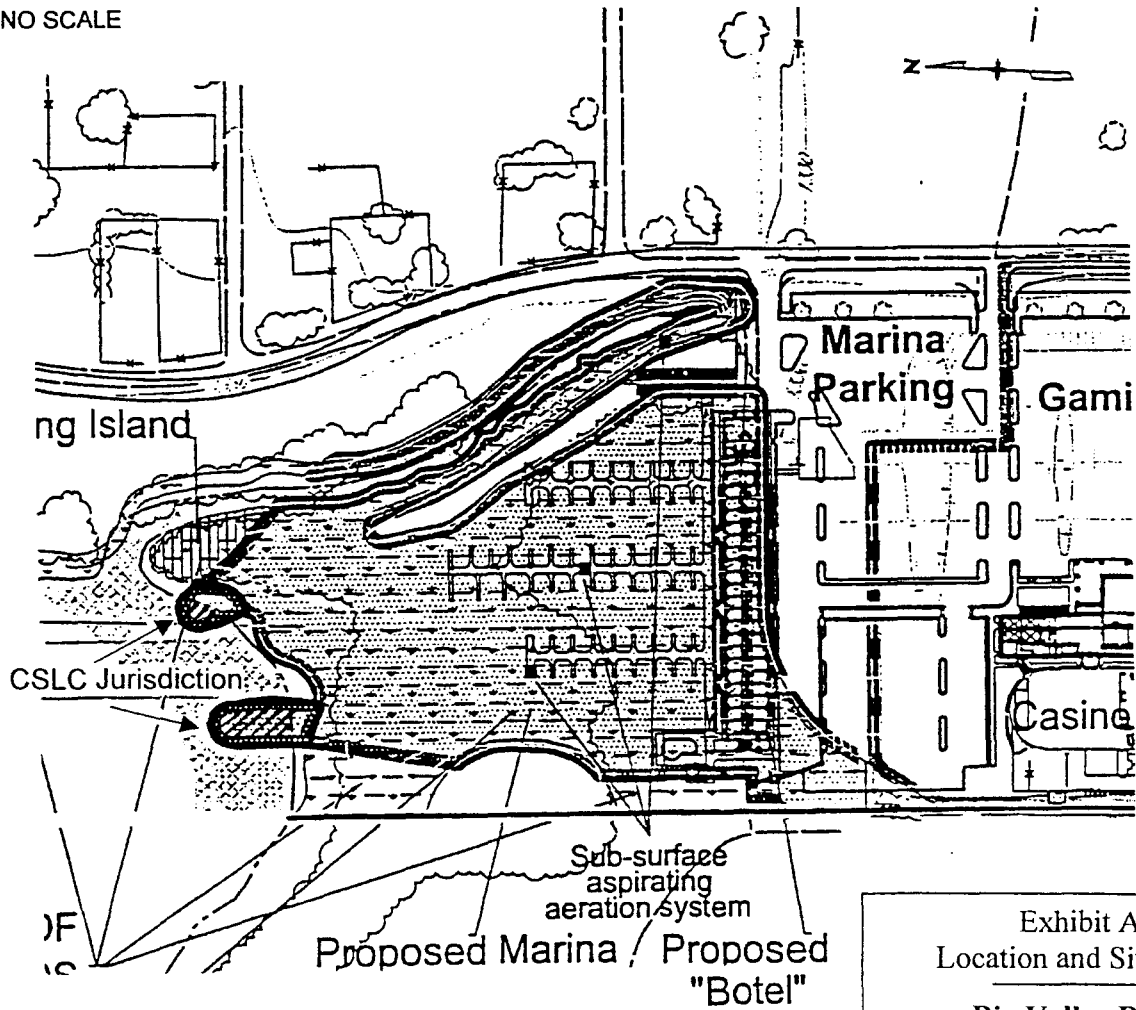
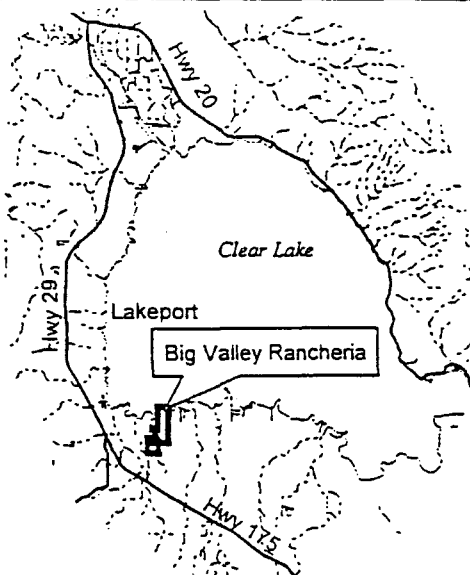


Exhibit A

FINDINGS:

1. State and local jurisdiction over the marina project is limited by the sovereignty of tribal lands.
2. CEQA review of the marina project is limited to impacts upon the State owned lands within the bed of Clear Lake up to the low water mark and upon the State public trust easement of the shoreline up to the high water mark of Clear Lake, as administered by the Lake County Shoreline Ordinance.
3. The wetland mitigation project is not located on tribal lands and is subject to full CEQA review.
4. The entire project is subject to federal jurisdiction and NEPA review.
5. Potential environmental impacts to wetlands from the marina project have been mitigated to less than significant levels by an offsite compensatory wetland restoration project and five year monitoring plan.
6. The project design and mitigation measures incorporated herein meet or exceed all state and local requirements such that any potential impacts are reduced to less than significant levels.
7. Potential environmental impacts from the marina and wetland mitigation project have been mitigated to less than significant levels by the project design and permit conditions of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers 404 permit, the U.S. EPA Water Quality Certification, the State Lands Commission dredging lease, the California Regional Water Quality Control Board NPDES permit, the California Dept. of Fish & Game Streambed Alteration permit, the Lake County Lakebed Encroachment Permit, the Lake County Minor Use permit and the Lake County Grading Permit.
8. Potential environmental impacts regarding air quality due to the wetland mitigation project have been reduced to less than significant levels by use permit conditions B1 through B3.
9. Potential environmental impacts regarding biological resources due to the wetland mitigation project have been mitigated to less than significant levels by use permit conditions D1 through D3 and payment of the State Fish & Game fees.

10. Potential environmental impacts regarding traffic and circulation due to the wetland mitigation project have been mitigated to less than significant levels by use permit conditions E1 through E6.
11. Potential environmental impacts regarding geology, hydrology and water quality due to the wetland mitigation project have been mitigated to less than significant levels by use permit conditions F1 through F7.
12. Potential environmental impacts regarding noise due to the wetland mitigation project have been mitigated to less than significant levels by use permit conditions G1 and G2.
13. Potential environmental impacts regarding cultural resources due to the wetland mitigation project have been mitigated to less than significant levels by use permit condition H1.
14. This project is consistent with land uses in the vicinity.
15. This project is consistent with the Lake County General Plan and Shoreline Ordinance.
16. The wetland mitigation project is consistent with the Lake County Zoning Ordinance and Grading Ordinance.
17. This project, as mitigated, will not result in any significant adverse environmental impacts.
