GENERAL LEASE - PUBLIC AGENCY USE

APPLICANT:

Suisun Resource Conservation District 2544 Grizzly Island Road Suisun, CA 94585-9539

AREA, LAND TYPE, AND LOCATION:

Sovereign lands in the Suisun Slough, Lower Joice Island, Solano County.

AUTHORIZED USE:

Construction of erosion control measures consisting of brush boxes and the planting of tules along 1,000 to 1,800 feet of shoreline at multiple sites along the Suisun Slough.

LEASE TERM:

Ten years, beginning June 20, 2005.

CONSIDERATION:

The public use and benefit; with the State reserving the right at any time to set a monetary rent if the Commission finds such action to be in the State's best interest.

OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:

- 1. Applicant has the right to use and owns the uplands adjoining the lease premises.
- 2. The Suisun Resource Conservation District has applied for a General Lease Public Agency Use for the construction of erosion control measures consisting of brush boxes and planting of tules along 1,000 to 1,800 feet of shoreline at multiple sites along the Suisun Slough. This may involve the placement of up to 667 cubic yards or 5,475 square feet of organic branch habitat (fill). No permanent structures will be

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constructed. All work will be done by hand at low tide. The proposed erosion control measures are environmentally benign measures used as an alternative to "traditional" techniques such as riprap. The techniques involves the placement of wooden stakes outboard of levees, securing branches between parallel rows of the stakes and then planting tules into the newly-created brush boxes. These structures dampen the corrosive effect of boat wakes and foster the growth of planted and naturally recruited riparian plants. The project is expected to result in both protection of the levees and habitat improvement.

3. Pursuant to the Commission's delegation of authority and the State CEQA Guidelines (Title 14, California Code of Regulations, section 15061), the staff has determined that this activity is exempt from the requirements of the CEQA as a categorically exempt project. The project is exempt under Class 4, Minor Alterations to Land.

Authority: Public Resources Code section 21084 and Title 14, California Code of Regulations, section 15304.

4. This activity involves lands identified as possessing significant environmental values pursuant to Public Resources Code sections 6370, et seq. Based upon the staff's consultation with the persons nominating such lands and through the CEQA review process, it is the staff's opinion that the project, as proposed, is consistent with its use classification.




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
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
SITE MAP
