GENERAL LEASE - PUBLIC AGENCY USE

APPLICANT:

National Marine Fisheries Service, Habitat Restoration Division 777 Sonoma Avenue, Rm 325 Santa Rosa, CA 95404

AREA, LAND TYPE, AND LOCATION:

Sovereign lands in South San Francisco Bay, at Bair Island, Redwood City, San Mateo County.

AUTHORIZED USE:

Construction of a native oyster habitat restoration project.

LEASE TERM:

Five years, beginning June 20, 2005.

CONSIDERATION:

The public use and benefit; with the State reserving the right at any time to set a monetary rent if the Commission finds such action to be in the State's best interest.

OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:

1. The proposed project is a research project that entails the placement of bagged oysters on pallets and frame structures, as well as placement of shells on stakes at two main sites in San Mateo County. The shells are clean and are used only as substrate for the natural recruitment of aquatic organisms in South San Francisco Bay.

The purpose of the project is to evaluate the feasibility of restoring oyster reef habitat in South San Francisco Bay. The project will compare different methods of substrate placement and observe natural recruitment and survival of native oyster larvae, as well as monitor for predation and disease that may be limiting natural re-establishment of oyster

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populations. The results of this pilot restoration effort will contribute to the design and implementation of future large-scale oyster restoration efforts in South San Francisco Bay. The lease will provide that Lessee will provide final reports and evaluations of this data collection effort to staff of the Commisison. The project will entail placement of fill (bags of oyster shell) into shallow subtidal areas. The volume of solid fill to be placed in water is 938.2 cubic feet, and total area to be covered by solid fill is 316.4 square feet.

3. Pursuant to the Commission's delegation of authority and the State CEQA Guidelines (Title 14, California Code of Regulations, section 15061), the staff has determined that this activity is exempt from the requirements of the CEQA as a categorically exempt project as a categorically exempt project. The project is exempt under Class 6, Information Collection; Title 14, California Code of Regulations, section 15306.

Authority: Public Resources Code section 21084 and Title 14, California Code of Regulations, section 15300.

4. This activity involves lands identified as possessing significant environmental values pursuant to Public Resources Code sections 6370, et seq. Based upon the staff's consultation with the persons nominating such lands and through the CEQA review process, it is the staff's opinion that the project, as proposed, is consistent with its use classification.
