# CALENDAR ITEM

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#### **GENERAL LEASE - PUBLIC AGENCY USE**

#### APPLICANT:

City of Suisun City

#### AREA, LAND TYPE, AND LOCATION:

Sovereign lands in Suisun Slough, city of Suisun City, Solano County.

#### AUTHORIZED USE:

Reconstruction and replacement of an existing stormwater pump station and outfall pipes and the placement of riprap as shown on Exhibit A.

#### LEASE TERM:

20 years, beginning June 26, 2006.

#### **CONSIDERATION:**

The public use and benefit, with the State reserving the right at any time to set a monetary rent if the Commission finds such action to be in the State's best interest.

#### **OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:**

- 1. Applicant owns the uplands adjoining the lease premises.
- 2. In March 2000, the San Francisco Bay Conservation and Development Commission advised CSLC staff that the Farifield Suisun Sewer District planned to reconstruct and replace an existing stormwater pump station and associated outfall pipes known as the Mulberry Pump Station. The Sewer District was advised at that time that a lease would be required, but a lease for the facilities was never obtained. The District operates the Mulberry Pump Station, but the facilities and the uplands are owned by the city of Suisun City. The city of Suisun City is now applying for a General Lease - Public Agency Use.

- 3. On February 12, 2000, the San Francisco Bay Conservation and Development Commission (BCDC), acting under its certified program [Title 14, California Code of Regulations, section 15251(h)], determined that the reconstruction and replacement of the existing stormwater pump station and outfall pipes and placement of riprap at the Mulberry Pump Station, as described above, were categorically exempt from the CEQA pursuant to section 15302 (c) Class 2; Replacement or reconstruction of existing utility systems and/or facilities involving negligible or no expansion of capacity. Staff concurs with the BCDC's determination.
- 4. This activity involves lands identified as possessing significant environmental values pursuant to Public Resoucres Code section 6370, et. seq. Based upon the staff's consultation with the persons nominating such lands and through the CEQA review process, it is the staff's opinion that the project, as proposed, is consistent with its use classification.
