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**CONSIDER ACCEPTANCE OF THE FULL QUITCLAIM DEED OF  
OIL AND GAS LEASE NO. PRC 2991.1 (A PARCEL OF TIDE AND  
SUBMERGED LANDS IN THE SANTA BARBARA CHANNEL  
LYING IN THE VICINITY OF EL CAPITAN BEACH STATE PARK),  
SANTA BARBARA COUNTY**

**AREA, LAND TYPE, AND LOCATION:**

Oil and Gas Lease No. PRC 2991.1 contains approximately 4,250.14 acres of tide and submerged lands in the Santa Barbara Channel in the vicinity of El Capitan Beach State Park, Santa Barbara County.

**BACKGROUND:**

On February 28, 1963, the California State Lands Commission (Commission) awarded Oil and Gas Lease No. PRC 2991.1 to Union Oil Company of California (Unocal) for the cash bonus of \$267,000.00. In 2005, Unocal was acquired by the parent of Chevron U.S.A. Inc. (Chevron). Three exploratory wells have been drilled on this lease and all of these wells have been plugged and abandoned and all debris has been removed from the leased lands.

On April 14, 2008, staff received a quitclaim deed for Lease No. PRC 2991.1 from Chevron. Public Resources Code section 6804.1 and Lease Paragraph 5 permit the lessee to make and file at any time a written quitclaim of all rights under the lease. The quitclaim will be effective when it is filed with the State subject to the continued obligation of the lessee and its surety to pay all accrued rentals and royalties and to abandon all wells drilled on the leased lands.

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3. AUTHORIZE THE EXECUTIVE OFFICER OR HIS DESIGNEE TO EXECUTE ANY DOCUMENTS NECESSARY TO IMPLEMENT THE COMMISSION'S ACTION.
