# **GENERAL LEASE - PUBLIC AGENCY USE**

### **APPLICANT**:

California Department of Fish and Game 1416 Ninth Street Sacramento, CA 95814

### AREA, LAND TYPE, AND LOCATION:

311 acres, more or less, of sovereign lands located at the Goose Flats and Big Hole areas, adjacent to the Colorado River, near Blythe, Riverside County.

### AUTHORIZED USE:

Continued use and maintenance of 311 acres for habitat restoration and revegetation.

#### LEASE TERM:

Ten years, beginning May 1, 2008.

### CONSIDERATION:

The public use and benefit; with the State reserving the right at any time to set a monetary rent if the Commission finds such action to be in the State's best interest.

### **OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:**

- 1. Applicant has the right to use uplands adjoining the lease premises.
- 2. On June 19, 1998, the Commission authorized the issuance of a ten-year General Lease -Public Agency Use, Lease No. PRC 7191.9, to the California Department of Fish and Game (DFG) for habitat restoration at Goose Flats and Big Hole sites adjacent to the Colorado River. The Lease expired on April 30, 2008. As DFG is continuing to manage the State's sovereign lands for their ecological value and continues to pursue habitat restoration projects at the sites, DFG has applied for a new ten-year lease.

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- 3. Major portions of the Lease Premises remain accessible to the public, including the entire River waterfront, and the backwater areas are accessible by boat.
- 4. Pursuant to the Commission's delegation of authority and the State CEQA Guidelines (Title 14, California Code of Regulations, section 15061), the staff has determined that this activity is exempt from the requirements of the CEQA as a categorically exempt project. The project is exempt under Class 4, Minor Alterations to Land; Title 14, California Code of Regulations, section 15304.

Authority: Public Resources Code section 21084 and Title 14, California Code of Regulations, section 15300.

5. This activity involves lands identified as possessing significant environmental values pursuant to Public Resources Code sections 6370, et seq. Based upon the staff's consultation with the persons nominating such lands and through the CEQA review process, it is the staff's opinion that the project, as proposed, is consistent with its use classification.
