CHAP. XLIX.—*An Act to abolish the State Board of Tide Land Commissioners, and to repeal sections three hundred and sixty-five and six hundred and ninety-eight of the Political Code.*

[Approved February 4, 1876.]

The People of the State of California, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The State Board of Tide Land Commissioners State Board abolished. is hereby abolished.

SEC. 2. All books, maps, papers, and documents belonging to the archives of said Board, and all other property of the State under its custody or control, must be deposited Books, papers, etc. with and kept and preserved by the Surveyor-General of the State.

SEC. 3. Sections three hundred and sixty-five and six hundred and ninety-eight of the Political Code are hereby Sections repealed. repealed.

SEC. 4. An Act entitled "An Act supplementary to and amendatory of an Act supplementary to and amendatory of an Act entitled an Act to survey and dispose of certain salt marsh and tide lands belonging to the State of California, approved March thirtieth, eighteen hundred and sixty-eight, also an Act approved April first, eighteen hundred and seventy," approved March thirtieth, eighteen hundred and seventy-four, is hereby Acts repealed. repealed.

SEC. 5. This Act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
